### HOKIES HOST GEORGIA TECH IN KEY ACC WEEKEND; STARTS FRIDAY WITH A DH

**The weekend series:** The Hokies, who own a 6-3 ACC record at English Field at Union Park, will look to keep that success going this weekend when they host Georgia Tech. The series with the Yellow Jackets now starts on Friday with a doubleheader, first pitch of the first game is scheduled for an 11 a.m. start. Saturday's third game is slated for a 1 p.m. start, but will be determined by the weather.

**Facing the Yellow Jackets:** Before joining the ACC, the two Techs played just six times starting in 1980, with the Jackets owning a 2-4 record. Since 2005, the two teams have played at least three times a season and the Jackets now hold a 29-15 edge in the series. They've won four straight and the Hokies have won just two series in their history - 2007 and 2010, both in Atlanta. In the five series played in Blacksburg, the Hokies have gone 1-2 each weekend.

**Tech among the nation's leaders - individuals:** There are six Hokies that are among the Top 50 (and ties) in the nation in nine statistical categories with Sam Fragale leading the charge - ranking in five. Below are those five men and where they rank in that particular category:

**Tech stays in front, leads nation in home runs:** The Hokies and Wake Forest have been battling back and forth recently for the nation's lead in home runs. With its two on Tuesday night, and the Demon Deacons failing to hit one the same day, the Hokies are now in front 70-69, with Mercer sitting in third place with a total of 67 home runs.

Since the Hokies joined the ACC (2005), Tech has surpassed 40 home runs hit in a season six times and 50 just four times. Within reach is the most home runs hit by a Tech team in an ACC season set by the 2010 squad with 81. (For more on home runs, see page 10).

**Hokies ranked in Top 25 nationally in five others:** Entering the weekend, Tech is also Top 25 in five other statistical categories, which includes: 4th in Hit By Pitch (69), 7th in Slugging Percentage (.505), 19th in Double Plays (37), 22nd in Runs (278) and 23rd in Hits (396).

# #22 Patrick Mason

## Virginia Tech Head Coach - Fourth Season



On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the last 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reigns after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 20th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including the Huskies' Matt Morizio and Dan Milano at Northeastern. The drafting of the Hokies' catcher Mark Zagunis in the third round (78th pick) of the 2014 draft only continued that trend.

In the 2015 draft, Tech had four players chosen including pitcher Sean Keselica, which brought the total number of Tech pitchers who signed pro pitching contracts under Mason to 12, which included six off the 2013 roster - his last of three seasons as the Hokies' pitching coach.

In 2016, Tech had two more players drafted which continued a trend of at least two Hokies being selected during each MLB draft for the past eight years, which more than doubles the school's previous high streak of three. The 23 draft selections over the past six seasons in which Mason has been at Tech is the third-most over any six-year stretch in the program's history, behind the 2008-2013 and 2009-2014 spans (27 in each).

Also in 2016, Mason saw the first two Hokies from his tenure at the school reach the big leagues. Chad Pinder made his Major League debut on August 20 for the Oakland Athletics at the Chicago White Sox. Joe Mantipty made his MLB debut just weeks later for the Detroit Tigers at the Kansas City Royals on September 3.

In his first season at Tech, Mason inherited a staff that registered an ERA of 4.76 the year before, but lost the entire weekend starting rotation and four pitchers total to the MLB draft that combined for 316 innings (58% of the team's total in 2010), 323 strikeouts (61%), 25 wins, six saves and a 3.95 ERA.

All he did was guide the 2011 Hokies' staff to posting a 4.57 ERA and allowing just 23 home runs. Since 1995, when the team had a 4.10 ERA, only one squad (2003, 4.50 ERA) posted an ERA better than the 2011 staff. Also, the home runs were the fewest allowed by a staff since 1977 (17) and only the 1979 team (25) surrendered fewer than 32 in the 34-year span since '77.

Lastly, he helped Joe Parsons rebound from a rough junior season (just 5.1 innings pitched and a 10.13 ERA) to registering a team-best 7-3 record with a complete game shutout and another combined shutout and a team-low 3.21 ERA (75.2 IP). Parsons signed a pro contract with the Pittsburgh Pirates organization after graduation.

Mason followed his first season in Blacksburg with an even better second year, as his staff lowered its ERA to 4.16, the second lowest ERA at the school in almost 30 years when the 1984 staff registered an ERA of 3.80. The staff also allowed 24 long balls, the second fewest since 1977.

Following the 2012 season, four pitchers were either drafted or signed pro contracts highlighted by Mantipty's selection by the Philadelphia Phillies and Ronnie Shaban's selected by the St. Louis Cardinals. Andrew Aizenstadt signed a pro contract with the Philadelphia Phillies, while Patrick Scoggin signed a pro contract with the Atlanta Braves.

In 2013, Mason's staff did it again, lowering the team ERA to 4.14 and allowing just 24 home runs. Those numbers included eight postseason games in which the staff posted a 2.28 ERA in 71.0 innings pitched. In Tech's previous postseason (2010), the staff threw 64.0 innings and had a 5.20 ERA.

The pro prospects continued to pile up under Mason, as four pitchers - Jake Joyce (Washington Nationals), Eddie Campbell (Seattle Mariners), Colin O'Keefe (Los Angeles Angels) and Mantipty (Detroit Tigers), again - were drafted by Major League clubs. Two more signed pro contracts as Devin Burke signed with the Colorado Rockies and Clark Labitan signed with the Frontier League's Schaumburg Boomers.

In his three years as pitching coach, the Tech staff registered three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year and posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hadn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976 and 1977 teams, something the 2012 and 2013 teams accomplished.

In his second season as head coach, Mason guided the Hokies to an eighth-place finish in the ACC and a berth into the league's championship tournament. He also coached Tech's first Academic All-American (Erik Payne, second team) in more than 10 years.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Massachusetts, native was the team's captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

Mason and his wife, Leigh, reside in Blacksburg and have a daughter, Anna and son, Benjamin.

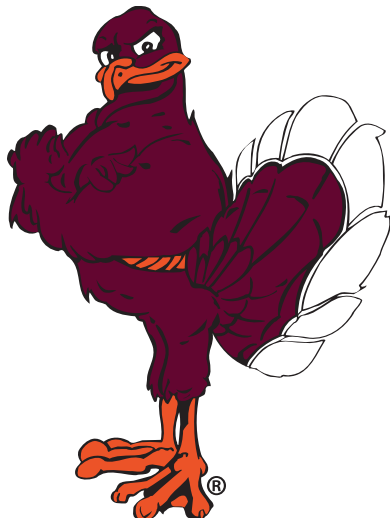

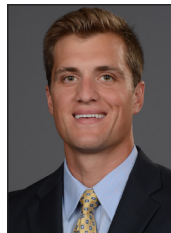

### WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!**  
**Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!**  
**Sola-Rex Sola-Rah**  
**Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!**  
**Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

### JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

**Facing nationally-ranked teams:** The chart on the left shows how the Hokies have fared against any ranked opponent in their history as a member of the ACC. In 2015, the team went 5-6 against ranked teams, but the Hokies faltered last season with just a 2-13 mark.

March 17-19 marked the first time Tech faced a ranked team in 2017, and the team beat top-ranked Florida State, 2-1. They lost three straight to No. 4 Clemson and took one from No. 12 Virginia last weekend. Tech could face two more ranked teams the rest of the regular season.

In its history, Tech has won 11 ACC series over ranked teams, eight of which have come at home - and the last time prior to this season was in 2015 over No. 1 Virginia. The Hokies' last series win on the road against a ranked team was in 2010, at No. 3 Georgia Tech.

**Hosting a top-ranked team:** Since the Hokies joined the ACC, they have played six series at English Field at Union Park against a No. 1 team. Overall, Tech is 7-13 in such games and includes two series wins in its last two. In 2015, Tech swept No. 1 Virginia and the 2017 squad took two-of-three from Florida State (March 17-19).

The other top-ranked teams to visit Blacksburg were UNC (2013, 0-3), Virginia (2011, 0-3), UNC (2009, 0-2), Miami (2008, 1-2) and Florida State (2006, 1-2).

**Tech sweeps an ACC opponent:** At the start of the month, Tech took three games from Boston College and continued its success against the Eagles in Blacksburg. In its history in the ACC, Tech has swept nine opponents, with six of those coming at home - four of them (2010, 2012, 2015, 2017) were against Boston College. The other home sweeps include Pitt (2015) and No. 1 Virginia (2015), the team's only sweep of a nationally-ranked opponent since joining the league.

On the road, Tech has just three sweeps and two were at former member Maryland (2009, 2011). The program's only other sweep on the road was at Duke in 2013.

**ACC Doubleheaders:** In its history in the ACC, Tech has played 19 doubleheaders and overall are 2-7-10, which includes an 0-1-1 record this season. Of those 19 DHs, 10 of them have been on the road and Tech is just 0-4-6 in those games. The Hokies split a DH at Duke to open the ACC slate this year (March 11), but dropped both ends of one at Pittsburgh (March 25).

The Hokies are 2-3-4 in ACC doubleheaders played at English Field at Union Park. Their last DH result at home was a split last year against Duke (April 23), while their last DH sweep was over Pitt (March 15) in 2014.

## English Field at Union Park

On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium in Blacksburg to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust. The stadium will be upgraded substantially, with help from \$3.5 million committed by the Richmond-based bank. On the date, Virginia Tech's Board of Visitors approved extending the naming rights to the stadium to Union for 10 years in recognition of the company's financial support.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934. He contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility.

Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 29 seasons at English Field at Union Park can be seen on the right. Before it, the Hokies played their home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,246-554-12 (.691) in games played in Blacksburg.

**Road Warriors:** The Hokies opened the 2017 season with four straight wins on the road - three at USC Upstate and one at Nevada - for the first time since the 2009 season. After a Friday loss to the Wolf Pack, Tech responded with two more wins improving to 6-1 on the road - marking its best start to a season on the road since 1992, when the Hokies won their first seven games.

Tech has already won more games on the road this year than they did all of last season, as it picked up win No. 8 at Radford April 11. The 2016 team won five on the road, the 2015 team also won eight and in 2014, the Hokies won just four. The last time Tech won more than 10 games on the road was 2013, when the squad went 13-8.

**Fast start to the season:** In the last 50 seasons, the Hokies have started the season 4-0 just 10 times and seven of those times the team won their next game to get to 5-0, including this year's squad. Only the 1987 team was able to win its first six games and actually went 8-0 before its first loss of the season.

In the previous nine seasons when Tech opened with four straight wins, the team finished the season at least 10 games over .500 and seven of those squads won at least 32 games. The only teams that did not were in 1978 (27-17) and 1969 (27-7). When pushing that to a 5-0 start, the previous six squads all finished the season at least 16 games over .500.

**Hokies in extra innings:** Tech has already played five extra-inning games this season, and the team has been on the short end of four - three at home and one on the road. The losses included losing two 11-inning games to Binghamton (March 4), the first time Tech played two extra-inning games in the same day as a member of the ACC.

Since joining the league, Tech has played back-to-back extra-inning games three times, once at High Point (Feb. 26-27, 2005) a 7-5 win in 10 and a 6-5 win in 12, once versus Boston College (March 25-26, 2006) losing 6-4 in 13 and 9-7 in 10, and the last time at The Citadel Tournament in Charleston, S.C. winning 5-4 in 11 against the Bulldogs, and beating UNC Asheville 9-6 in 10 on Feb. 23-24, 2007.

The Hokies played just one extra-inning game last year and were 2-2 in extra-inning games in 2015. In 2014, Tech played six extra-inning games a season after playing seven in 2013.

**Tech putting runs on the scoreboard:** The Hokies have scored in 130 innings this year and have scored multiple runs in an inning 62 times and a single run 68 times. When Tech scores at least seven runs in a contest, the team is 17-4, and are 8-1 when reaching double figures.

**Home run totals a team effort:** The 2010 team is the last squad to have at least five Hokies hit more than five home runs in a single season. The 2017 squad currently has seven members with at least five long balls led by Sam Fragale's 14, while Rahiem Cooper has 11 and Mac Caples has nine. Joe Freiday, Jr. (8), Ryan Tufts (7), Tom Stoffel (6) and JD Mundy (5) all now have at least five with Nick Anderson just outside with four.

Back in 2010, eight Hokies hit at least five, led by Steve Domecus and Buddy Sosnoskie, who each hit 13 to lead the team. Austin Wates and Ronnie Shaban both had eight, Tim Smalling and Michael Seaborn both hit seven and Andrew Rash added six. Anthony Sosnoskie ended the year with five.

**A trio of double-digit home run hitters:** Cooper smacked two home runs in the Virginia series (4/3-15) to push his home run total into double figures, while Mac Caples' home run Tuesday at ETSU gave him nine for the year. Along with Fragale's output, Tech is on the verge of having the first trio of 10+ home run hitters in school history since the team joined the league back in 2005.

In fact, not since 1999 have three Hokies reached at least 10 home runs, when Larry Bowles (14), Matt Griswold (12) and Barry Gauch (10) accomplished the feat. If Tech has four players reach 10 home runs, that has only happened once since 1989, back during the 1997 season with Gauch (14), Griswold (13), Kevin Kurilla (13) and Matt Reynolds (10) all reaching the 10-homer plateau.

In 1989 and 1995, the team also had three men reach 10 home runs. In 1988, seven guys hit at least 13 home runs for Tech (see next note).

**Reaching the 70-home run mark:** In its history, the Hokies have hit 70 or more home runs in a season 12 times, which now includes the 2017 squad. However, from 1981 through 1988, the team hit at least 78 or more seven out of the eight seasons with the high-water mark being the 140 smacked in 1988.

Since the home run barrage of the 1980s, only four times before this year, has a Tech team reached 73 or more - in 29 seasons, which coincides with the Hokies moving into English Field at Union Park.

Those seasons include 2010 (81), 1997 (80), 1999 (74) and 1995 (73).

**Hokies with three shutouts:** With their efforts this season - shutouts against Marshall (Feb. 21), Canisius (March 13) and Florida State (March 19) - Tech has now registered three shutouts this year. It may not seem like many, but that matches the most in a single season (2012, 2013, 2016) since the 2011 staff posted a total of four. Since joining the league, the most shutouts recorded in a single season was six by the 2010 staff.

When it comes to shutouts in the ACC, Tech's one this season matches the output by the 2005, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2016 staffs. The only season Tech posted more than one shutout in an ACC game was 2013, when it had two.

**Scheetz moving up the charts:** In his fourth season with the Hokies, Kit Scheetz has been moving up Tech's all-time charts when it comes to those who pitched in the ACC. Below is where he ranks in four categories, who leads that list and who is next on the list.

**Hokies top 20 in nation turning the double play:** Entering the weekend, Tech is ranked 19th in the nation in double plays turned with 37.

The chart on the right shows every pitcher on Tech's staff that has had a double play turned behind him this year and in his career and what kind.

Andrew McDonald currently leads the team with seven, while Joey Sullivan has six and Nick Anderson has had five turned behind them.

In their history in the ACC, the most double plays the team has turned in a single season is 62, in 62 games back in 2013, while the highest per game average was 1.15 (59 in 51 games) in 2005. The Hokies are currently turning 0.95 double plays per game.

**Starting note to start the season:**

Packy Naughton was Tech's season opening starter at USC Upstate (Feb. 17), marking the first Hokie to start back-to-back season openers since David Cross in 2006-07. Joe Mantiply is the only other Tech pitcher to start two season openers over the past dozen seasons (2011, 2013).

**Anderson named ACC Pitcher of the Week:** For his effort against Florida State (March 19) in a 17-0 Tech victory - a career-high 8.0 innings pitched, five hits, two walks, five strikeouts - Nick Anderson earned his first ACC Pitcher of the Week honor and became just the fourth Hokie to ever earn the honor - along with Justin Wright (2009, 2010, 2x), Ryan Kennedy (2005, 2x) and Sean Keselica (2015, 2x).

**McGarity for the save:** Aaron McGarity has 15 appearances this year, has finished a team-high 13 and already has saved five games, a season-high for him. His next save would tie for the second most ever in an ACC season with Ben Rowen (2010), while Clark Labitan's 11 in 2013 is the most.

**Starting note:** In 2016, only two Hokies started every game for Tech (55) - Phil Sciretta and Ryan Tufts. Sciretta graduated but is still working with the program, which left Tufts as Tech's consecutive starts streak holder - which he entered the season with 72 straight starts, after starting the last 17 of the 2015 season.

Tufts has pushed that starts streak to 111 straight, and includes 94 straight starts at shortstop.

**Reaching the century mark:** Ironically, in the same game, both Tom Stoffel and Sam Fragale (March 18 vs. Florida State) each pushed past the century mark in career hits for Tech.

Stoffel was the first to reach the mark, as his three-run home run in the fourth inning was his 100th hit as a Hokies. Two frames later, it was Fragale's turn, as his two-RBI double was the 100th of his career.

**Speaking of that Florida State game:** Tech trailed in that game (March 18) by eight runs before Mother Nature added a 90-minute rain delay to the contest.

Behind Stoffel and Fragale, the Hokies outscored the Seminoles 11-2 starting in the bottom of the fourth as it erased the eight-run deficit and pulled out the 13-12 win over then-No. 1 Florida State.

The eight-run deficit matched its biggest deficit overcome to win an ACC game and matched its biggest deficit overcome ever (since joining the league).

Last season, Tech came back from eight runs down at Liberty (April 26, 2016), to win 11-10 (trailed 10-2 after seven frames), while their largest ACC deficit overcome was also eight. On March 14, 2014, the Hokies trailed Pitt 10-2 entering the bottom of the fifth, and came back to win, also, 11-10.

**Fragale started off fast, got national recognition:** Sam Fragale's 2017 opening day performance included three home runs in his first three at bats and a 5-for-5 day with a double and triple and a career-high seven RBI.

He became the first Tech player with a three-home run game since Chris Kay (May 10, 2009 vs. Delaware State) and was just the fifth Hokie with seven RBI in a single game since Virginia Tech joined the ACC. It was also the most total bases for a Tech player (17) since Brad Bauder set the school record with 23 at Georgetown (April 21, 2002).

For his effort, he was named the ACC's Player of the Week and was one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week. Fragale was also one of three nominated for the "Gold Standard Performance of the Week!" as recognized by USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award.

**Cooper upped the effort:** Rahiem Cooper matched Fragale's effort at USC Upstate with a three-home run game and actually upped the effort as two of his home runs were grand slams. Cooper became the first Hokie (in recorded history) to hit two grand slams in the same game - at Nevada (Feb. 26) - and the 17th Hokie since Tech has been a member of the ACC to hit one.

He joined Ronnie Shaban (2009-12) as the only two Hokies with multiple grand slams in their ACC career, as Shaban hit three while at Tech.

Cooper also became just the fifth player during the program's time in the ACC to hit three home runs in one game and the second this season.

His nine RBI in the game was the most ever for a Tech player since Brad Bauder set the school record with 14 at Georgetown (April 21, 2002).

For his effort, Cooper was also named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week for the second week of the season.
