Tech on TV: The Hokies are scheduled to appear on television two times this season:

Sunday, April 4: Virginia Tech at Florida State, 1 p.m. Fox Sports Florida

Saturday, April 10: Miami at Virginia Tech, 1 p.m. Regional Sports Networks (RSN)

-RSN includes Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Fox Sports Net South, Fox Sports Florida, and the New England Sports Network.

-Fox Sports Florida is available to a national audience via DirecTV channel 654 and Dish Network channel 423.

Double digits: The Hokies recorded at least 10 hits in their first 11 games of the season before being held to six hits by Bryant on March 10.

Tech in ACC openers: The Hokies have a 2-3 record in ACC season openers after defeating Duke 19-4 in Durham last year. In ACC opening series, Tech has posted a 4-11 mark during its five years in the league, including a 1-2 mark at Maryland in 2005, an 0-3 mark at Miami in 2006, a 2-1 mark at Georgia Tech in 2007, an 0-3 record at Georgia Tech in 2008 and a 1-2 record at Duke in 2009. This is the first time that Tech has opened the ACC slate at home.

Home sweet home: The Hokies are in the midst of a 12-game homestand, which, barring any postponements or cancellations, would tie for the longest home stand since 1990.

No rest for the weary: Beginning on March 5, the Hokies are scheduled to play 12 games in 13 days. Extended out further, Tech will play 15 games in 17 days, 17 in 20 and 20 in 24.

Tough road ahead: The Hokies could very well have the toughest road schedule in the nation, as all five of their conference road trips come at schools ranked among the top 15 in the latest Collegiate Baseball poll: No. 3 Florida State, No. 4 Virginia, No. 5 Georgia Tech, No. 13 Clemson and No. 14 North Carolina.

Hughes on the rise: With this season's 9-3 start, head coach Pete Hughes has evened his record as Virginia Tech's skipper at .500 (87-87). He needs thirteen wins to reach 100 at Virginia Tech, and 11 wins to reach 400 in his career.

Triple your pleasure: When Austin Wates hit two triples against Charleston Southern Feb. 28, he tied a Virginia Tech single-game record shared by 10 others, and an ACC single-game record shared by 41 others. Wates accomplished the same feat as a freshman, tripling twice on May 7, 2008, against Liberty. Both triples in the Charleston Southern game came in the same inning (fifth), and although single-inning records are not kept, he would have at least tied that record as well.

Wates now has three triples on the season and has moved into a tie for third on Tech's all-time list with 12 for his career, sharing the spot with Chris Stanton (2002-05). David Dallas (1989-92) sits in second with 14, while Kevin Barker (1994-96) holds the record with 17.

He'll get the ball late in the game because of his personality, his competitive nature and his stuff, and we want to establish that early in our season. He can hit for average, he can hit for power, he can play infield and he can provide innings out of the bullpen. He's a very versatile guy."

Hughes says: "We've been waiting a year to get Tim in our lineup. We think he's a special player defensively. We also think he can have a lot of success at the plate for us. He can bring some added power to our lineup, and he is someone who has a lot of game experience at a high level of college baseball. To have him be a calming presence in our infield, where our pitchers know that a play on a routine ground ball is going to be made, is what Tim really brings to our lineup this year."

2010: Made his Hokie debut with a two-run single against Kentucky ... Had an RBI single against Coastal Carolina ... Went 5-for-5 with an RBI single and three runs scored against West Virginia ... Went 2-for-4 with a double, two RBIs and three runs scored in game one at CSU ... Went 2-for-5 with another double in game two ... Drove in a career-high six runs in game three, going 3-for-6 with another double and his first home run as a Hokie, a grand slam ... Went 8-for-17 with five runs scored and four RBIs in the Long Island series ... Doubled in game one and homered in

Hughes says: “Anthony has had a lot of experience at the catching position. He’s probably played the most baseball out of anyone in our program over the past three years. I think he’s really going to benefit from having such a solid core of guys at the position to rest him so he can be a better offensive player. We’re not going to ask him to catch 56 games for us. We are so deep at that position that I think he’ll be able to really benefit, especially toward the end of the year. I think he’s gotten tired in the past and it’s hurt him offensively. We expect him to do what seniors do – be a leader and a productive player for us.”

We will also look for him to give us some innings on the mound during the course of the season out of the bullpen. He’s shown glimpses of a player who can hit for average and power and steal some bases. He’s just got to be able to do that consistently. Hopefully, he can grow this year to be the player we recruited, which is a player who can run and hit for average with low strikeouts and some power potential.”

21 Austin Wates

UTL, 6-1. 179, R/R, Junior, Richmond, Va.

Hughes says: “Austin is going to have a big year because he’s so focused on winning and becoming a better baseball player for Virginia Tech. He’ll play in the outfield for us and he’ll play first base. Wherever we need him that day, he’ll play, and he’ll be very good at it. We look for him to really jump his stolen base totals up – we’ll cut him loose a little more. I think his power potential, at some point, is going to take off. I think he’s one of the most exciting players in our league. He’s the best athlete I’ve ever recruited, and he’s one of the better kids that I’ve coached, too. He’s all about winning at Virginia Tech and that’s why he’s made the jumps he’s made in the past two years. He’s unselfish and he’s focused on the right things.”

2010: Had a good all-around game in the season opener with Kentucky, tallying a single, a triple, two walks, two RBIs, a run scored and a stolen base ... Went 3-for-5 with three singles and an RBI against Coastal Carolina ... Went 2-for-4 with a double, an RBI and two runs scored against West Virginia ... Went 4-for-6 in game one at CSU with two runs ... Went 0-for-5 in game two, snapping a 17-game hitting streak that dated back to 2009 ... Hughes says: “Justin has been our most steady performer on the mound. A lot of people don’t know how many injuries he pitched through last year. He was never really healthy and he still had some quality wins for our program. He’s a guy who you put out there on the weekends and you feel really good about when you give him the ball going into the game. I don’t care who we play – when he has the ball in his hands, I feel really good about him pitching us into the seventh. I think he’s our top guy and we’re going to rely on him a lot over the course of the year. He’s a winner, we think he can handle a lot, and we’re going to give him a lot of responsibility.”

2010: Endured the roughest outing of his career in the season-opening loss against Kentucky, allowing career highs of 10 runs and eight unearned runs ... Was pulled after just 2.1 innings ... Hughes says: “I think we’re just going to focus on Marc being a pitcher here. I want him to have fewer things on his agenda. I just think he’s going to be able to reach his potential as a pitcher more quickly if he has fewer things on his plate. We think he has the ability to be really good. He’s got the stuff, and he just needs to settle in there, learn from experience and get better. We expect him to make a big jump for us this year.”

Hughes says: “Brent gives us good depth in the infield. He’s a good defender and will give us the possibility to also use some innings out of the bullpen mid-week.”
