## Hokie Notables

### Entering Today's Game

Today's game is the season-opener for the Hokies ... The Bears were set to open the 2009-10 season at St. Francis (N.Y.) on Friday night ... The game is an opening round match-up in the 2009 Philly Hoop Group Classic.



### Hokies in Season and Home Openers

Virginia Tech is 6-0 in season openers under **Seth Greenberg** and the same 6-0 in home openers under Greenberg ... The Hokies opened last season with a 65-62 victory over Gardner-Webb in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 36-10 in season openers since the opening of Cassell Coliseum (this does not include the season opener of the 1961-62 season, since Cassell opened in January of that season, nor does it include the season opener in the 2002-03 season that the Hokies lost to St. Bonaventure in the Paradise Jam, that was later vacated by St. Bonaventure due to an ineligible player) ... The Hokies are 46-2 all-time in home openers in Cassell Coliseum and won their first 25 home openers in the arena before losing to James Madison, 70-67, in the home opener in 1986.

### Delaney Named Preseason All-ACC

**Malcolm Delaney** was named to the preseason All-ACC team, in voting by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association at the league's ACC Operation Basketball at the Grandover Resort in Greensboro, N.C., on Oct. 25 ... Delaney, the top returning scorer in the ACC, is joined on the team by Greivis Vasquez of Maryland, Trevor Booker of Clemson, Kyle Singler of Duke and Ed Davis of North Carolina ... The Hokies were picked to finish eighth in the preseason poll.

### The Series vs. Brown

This will be just the second meeting between the Hokies and the Bears ... Tech defeated Brown, 95-52, on Dec. 28, 1977, in Cassell Coliseum in the only other meeting ... This is the Hokies' fourth-ever meeting with an Ivy League school ... Tech defeated Columbia, 64-52, in the first round of the 2008 Aeropostale Holiday Festival in Madison Square Garden on Dec. 20, 2008, and that was the Hokies first meeting with an Ivy League school since the first Brown meeting in 1977 ... The first-ever meeting between Tech and an Ivy League school was on Dec. 16, 1967, when the Hokies lost to Yale, 90-77, in a tournament in Charlottesville.

## Delaney Closing In

Virginia Tech junior guard **Malcolm Delaney** enters the 2009-10 season with 951 career points ... When he reaches the 1,000-point plateau, he will become the 40th player in school history to do so ... He will become the first Virginia Tech junior to reach that level since A.D. Vassallo did in the 2007-08 season ... Fellow junior **Jeff Allen** enters the season with 839 career points.

## Top Duos

The Virginia Tech duo of **Malcolm Delaney** and **Jeff Allen** are the second-highest scoring combo of players returning to the ACC this season ... Only the pairing of Kyle Singler (609 pts.) and Jon Scheyer (550 pts.) of Duke with 1,159 points scored more points than the combined 1,066 points netted by Delaney (615 pts.) and Allen (451 pts.) ... The only other returning duo in the league that combined for more than 1,000 points last year was Maryland's Greivis Vasquez (613 pts.) and Landon Milborne (400 pts.), who totaled 1,013 points in the 2008-09 season.

## Delaney Leads the Way

**Malcolm Delaney** is the top returning scorer in the ACC this season ... He scored 615 points last season, two better than Maryland's Greivis Vasquez ... Delaney also scored the most points by any ACC player in a game last season, with his 37 points in the home loss to #12 Clemson.

## New Faces

There are several new faces in the Virginia Tech men's basketball program this season ... **Bill Courtney** has joined the coaching staff, following stints at VCU, Virginia, Providence and George Mason ... New players include **Manny Atkins**, **Ben Boggs**, **Erick Green** and **Allan Chaney**, who will become eligible to play next season following his transfer from the University of Florida ... Also new on the bench is athletic trainer **Chad Hyatt**.

## Interesting Tidbit

This afternoon is the Hokies' first-ever game played on Nov. 15 ... This is not the earliest that the Hokies' have ever played a regular season basketball game ... That distinction goes to the season-opener in the 2007-08 season, when the Hokies defeated Elon, 69-64, in Cassell Coliseum on Nov. 10, 2007.

## Raines on the Shelf

Freshman forward **Cadarian Raines** will miss the first few weeks of the season following surgery on a fractured fifth metatarsal in his left foot ... The surgery was performed on September 23 and the prognosis was an 8-10 week absence ... Also on the injury front, sophomore **Allan Chaney**, who must redshirt the 2009-10 season following his transfer from the University of Florida, had surgery on a torn labrum in his left shoulder ... He will not be healthy enough to practice during the season.

## Honors for Greenberg

This summer, **Seth Greenberg** was informed of two honors he is to receive ... Earlier this fall, Greenberg received the Al LoBalbo Award from his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University ... ## Since Expansion

Since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and Boston College joined in 2005), the Hokies have the fourth-most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 38-42 in that stretch ... Only North Carolina (64-16), Duke (57-23) and Maryland (39-41) have more wins in that span (As of the end of the regular season).

## Complete Games

**Malcolm Delaney** was the only ACC player last season to record five games where he played every minute of action ... He was second in the ACC in minutes played.

## Overtime in the Cassell

Virginia Tech is 25-6 all-time in overtime games in Cassell Coliseum, including a 2-0 mark last season ... Tech has won its last three overtime games and its last four overtime games in Cassell.

## More on Malcolm

**Malcolm Delaney's** 37 points in the loss to #12/11 Clemson in Cassell Coliseum last season is the most points scored by an ACC player this season ... The last time an ACC player scored more than 37 points in a game was Jack McClinton of Miami, who scored 38 points against St. Mary's on March 21, 2008 ... The last time an ACC player scored more than 37 points in a conference game was on March 1, 2008, when Tyrese Rice scored 46 points against North Carolina and Sean Singletary scored 41 points against Miami on the same day.

## Showing Marked Improvement

**Malcolm Delaney** averaged 18.1 points per game last season, up 8.6 points per game from last season ... That was the best in the ACC last season ... Gani Lawal of Georgia Tech improved +7.8 ppg last season ... Delaney averaged 19.9 points per game in ACC games last season, up from 9.8 ppg last season in league play.

## Seth Likes the Cassell

**Seth Greenberg** is 71-25 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .740 ... Greenberg is 42-6 (.875) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

Tech was 2-10 in such games in the 2005-06 season, with 10 games being decided in the final seconds of action ... Tech's first four losses last season were by a total of eight points and two (Xavier and Wisconsin) came with less than one second on the clock.

## In the Cassell

The Hokies have a 480-144 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .769 winning percentage ... The Hokies were 10-6 in the Cassell last season and 14-3 in Cassell Coliseum during the 2007-08 season ... The win over Florida State in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Providence, 69-64, on Feb. 23, 2003, for the Hokies' 400th victory in the building ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech is now in its 46th season in Cassell ... The first basketball game was played in the Coliseum on Jan. 3, 1962, with the Hokies routing Alabama, 91-67 ... On Sept. 17, 1977, Tech dedicated the Coliseum in honor of the late Stuart K. Cassell ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum.

## Top-Flight New Digs

The dream has become a reality. In August of 2009, the Hokies moved into perhaps the finest practice facility in all of college basketball ... The \$21 million, 50,652 sq. ft., building is the new home to Virginia Tech basketball ... The main feature of the building is the two-court, 16,609 sq. ft., practice gym ... Spacious and convenient, the gym is equipped with a soft-wall that can be lowered to divide the courts to allow both the men's and the women's team to be able to practice at the same time ... The courts are exact replicas of the main court in Cassell Coliseum, allowing the team to practice on the same surface on which they will play ... The office suite on the second floor features five large offices for the assistants, a conference room and a huge office for the head coach ... A view of the practice courts is available from the head coaches' office, the large reception area and the connecting balcony ... Behind a secured entrance, the facility offers every imaginable feature needed to build a program ... The spacious weight room has the full range of free weights, machines, treadmills, ellipticals and other equipment ... All with a panoramic view of the practice courts ... Adjacent to the weight room is the modern, fully-equipped training room ... This area features two examination rooms, a taping area and hot and cold emmersion tubs. The sports medicine staff can handle all aspects of treatment and rehabilitation of injuries from this room ... Across the hall is the equipment room ... This area also opens out into the parking lot, where the team will begin its travel just steps from the locker room ... Speaking of the locker room, the fully-appointed lounge area is outfitted with a sound system, 62" flat screen television, refrigerator and computer workstations ... The complex also features a classroom with video and dry-erase boards ... The locker room itself is spacious, with video screens and large, individual lockers with extra storage space ... Immediately behind the practice gym is a large patio area. This area will be used for social events and tailgating functions.



## We Love the 90s

When Virginia Tech defeated Duquesne, 116-108 in double overtime on March 18th last season, it marked the 10th time under **Seth Greenberg** that Tech has scored 90-or-more points in a game ... The Hokies are 10-1 in those games ... Tech is 10-0 as an ACC team when scoring 90 points in a game ... Tech is 232-21 all-time when scoring 90-or-more points in a game ... Tech's all-time high in an ACC game was a 94-88 regulation win against #1 North Carolina on Jan. 13, 2007 in Cassell Coliseum.

## Lights, Camera, Hokies

Tech is 65-69 on television under **Seth Greenberg** ... The Hokies were 15-15 in televised games last season ... Tech is scheduled to make at least 19 television appearances this season ... The Hokies made a school-record 30 appearances last season and made a then-school-record 26 television appearances the year before ... All 16 ACC regular season games last season were televised, for the first time since joining the league in 2004.

## The State We're In

The win over Longwood on Dec. 14, 2008 was the Hokies' first game of the season against an in-state school ... The game against Longwood was the first-ever between the two schools ... The Hokies have now played 13 schools from the state ... The only other state Division I schools that Tech has not played are Norfolk State and Hampton ... Tech is 413-302 (.578) all-time against schools from Virginia and was 3-1 against in-state schools last year ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech will play a total of four regular season games against schools from the Commonwealth ... Tech is 18-12 against schools from Virginia under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech is scheduled to play four games against Virginia schools this season.

## About Seth

**Seth Greenberg** is in his seventh season as the head coach of the Hokies ... Greenberg has a 107-85 overall record in Blacksburg and is 320-255 in 19 seasons as a collegiate head coach ... Prior to Virginia Tech, Greenberg was the head coach at South Florida from 1997-2003 and Long Beach State from 1990-97 ... Greenberg was named the ACC Coach of the Year in the Hokies' first year in the league, 2004-05, and again in the 2007-08 season.
