## Hokie Notables

### Entering Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter tonight's game 1-0 on the season ... UNCG is 0-1 on the year, following a season-opening, 96-62, loss at Duke on Friday night.

### Last Time Out: VT 69, Brown 55

Virginia Tech opened the 2009-10 season with a 69-55 victory over Brown on Sunday afternoon in Cassell Coliseum ... **Malcolm Delaney** led all scorers with 21 points, while **Jeff Allen** added 17 points ... **Terrell Bell**, **Dorenzo Hudson** and **Victor Davila** each scored eight points in the win, which was an opening-round game in the 2009 Philly Hoop Group Classic ... The Hokies shot 46.4 percent from the floor and only committed eight turnovers on the afternoon ... Tech recorded 21 points off of 17 Brown turnovers in the contest.

### Delaney Named Preseason All-ACC

**Malcolm Delaney** was named to the preseason All-ACC team, in voting by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association at the league's ACC Operation Basketball at the Grandover Resort in Greensboro, N.C., on Oct. 25 ... Delaney, the top returning scorer in the ACC, is joined on the team by Greivis Vasquez of Maryland, Trevor Booker of Clemson, Kyle Singler of Duke and Ed Davis of North Carolina ... The Hokies were picked to finish eighth in the preseason poll.

### The Series vs. UNCG

This will be the sixth meeting between the Hokies and the Spartans ... Tech defeated UNCG, 67-39, in the last meeting between the two schools, on Dec. 4, 2007 in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech is 4-0 against UNCG in Cassell, in a series that began with an 86-59 Tech victory in Cassell Coliseum in 1993 ... The Hokies are 86-43 all-time against teams currently in the Southern Conference.

### Delaney Closing In

Virginia Tech junior guard **Malcolm Delaney** enters tonight's game with 972 career points ... When he reaches the 1,000-point plateau, he will become the 40th player in school history to do so ... He will become the first Virginia Tech junior to reach that level since A.D. Vassallo did in the 2007-08 season ... He will most likely become the ninth-fastest to the 1,000-point total at Virginia Tech in the last 50 years ... Fellow junior **Jeff Allen** has 856 career points.

## Top Duos

The Virginia Tech duo of **Malcolm Delaney** and **Jeff Allen** are the second-highest scoring combo of players returning to the ACC this season ... Only the pairing of Kyle Singler (609 pts.) and Jon Scheyer (550 pts.) of Duke with 1,159 points scored more points than the combined 1,066 points netted by Delaney (615 pts.) and Allen (451 pts.) ... The only other returning duo in the league that combined for more than 1,000 points last year was Maryland's Greivis Vasquez (613 pts.) and Landon Milborne (400 pts.), who totaled 1,013 points in the 2008-09 season.

## Rise and Give Me 20

When **Malcolm Delaney** scored 21 points in the season-opening win over Brown, it marks the 14th time in his Virginia Tech career that he has scored at least 20 points ... He achieved that feat once as a freshman, with 20 points at North Carolina and reached that plateau 12 times last season, including a 37-point performance against Clemson in Cassell Coliseum ... **Jeff Allen** has six 20-plus point games at Tech, including a 30-point game in the home win over Boston College last season ... **JT Thompson** recorded his first career 20-point game with 21 points in the win over Duquesne in the NIT last season.

In the win over Brown on Sunday, two Hokies tied or set career-highs in several categories ... **Dorenzo Hudson** recorded new career-highs with six assists and six rebounds ... Fellow junior **Terrell Bell** set a new career-high with 31 minutes of action and tied career-highs with four assists and seven rebounds.

New players include **Manny Atkins, Ben Boggs, Erick Green** and **Allan Chaney**, who will become eligible to play next season following his transfer from the University of Florida ... Also new on the bench is athletic trainer **Chad Hyatt**.

## Raines on the Shelf

Freshman forward **Cadarian Raines** will miss the first few weeks of the season following surgery on a fractured fifth metatarsal in his left foot ... The surgery was performed on September 23 and the prognosis was an 8-10 week absence ... Also on the injury front, sophomore **Allan Chaney**, who must redshirt the 2009-10 season following his transfer from the University of Florida, had surgery on a torn labrum in his left shoulder ... He will not be healthy enough to practice during the season.

## Since Expansion

Since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and Boston College joined in 2005), the Hokies have the fourth-most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 38-42 in that stretch ... Only North Carolina (64-16), Duke (57-23) and Maryland (39-41) have more wins in that span (As of the end of the regular season).

## All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is 1282-1070 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .545 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 101st season of men's basketball.

## November is a Kind Month

Virginia Tech is 67-28 all-time in games played in the month of November, for a .705 winning percentage ... It is the best winning percentage of any month for the Hokies.

## Complete Games

**Malcolm Delaney** was the only ACC player last season to record five games where he played every minute of action ... He was second in the ACC in minutes played.

### Showing Marked Improvement

**Malcolm Delaney** averaged 18.1 points per game last season, up 8.6 points per game from last season ... That was the best in the ACC last season ... Gani Lawal of Georgia Tech improved +7.8 ppg last season ... Delaney averaged 19.9 points per game in ACC games last season, up from 9.8 ppg last season in league play.

### More on Malcolm

**Malcolm Delaney's** 37 points in the loss to #12/11 Clemson in Cassell Coliseum last season is the most points scored by an ACC player this season ... The last time an ACC player scored more than 37 points in a game was Jack McClinton of Miami, who scored 38 points against St. Mary's on March 21, 2008 ... The last time an ACC player scored more than 37 points in a conference game was on March 1, 2008, when Tyrese Rice scored 46 points against North Carolina and Sean Singletary scored 41 points against Miami on the same day.

### Seth Likes the Cassell

**Seth Greenberg** is 72-25 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .742 ... Greenberg is 43-6 (.878) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

## Top-Flight New Digs

The dream has become a reality. In August of 2009, the Hokies moved into perhaps the finest practice facility in all of college basketball ... The \$21 million, 50,652 sq. ft., building is the new home to Virginia Tech basketball ... The main feature of the building is the two-court, 16,609 sq. ft., practice gym ... Spacious and convenient, the gym is equipped with a soft-wall that can be lowered to divide the courts to allow both the men's and the women's team to be able to practice at the same time ... The courts are exact replicas of the main court in Cassell Coliseum, allowing the team to practice on the same surface on which they will play ... The office suite on the second floor features five large offices for the assistants, a conference room and a huge office for the head coach ... A view of the practice courts is available from the head coaches' office, the large reception area and the connecting balcony ... Behind a secured entrance, the facility offers every imaginable feature needed to build a program ... The spacious weight room has the full range of free weights, machines, treadmills, ellipticals and other equipment ... All with a panoramic view of the practice courts ... Adjacent to the weight room is the modern, fully-equipped training room ... This area features two examination rooms, a taping area and hot and cold emmersion tubs. The sports medicine staff can handle all aspects of treatment and rehabilitation of injuries from this room ... Across the hall is the equipment room ... This area also opens out into the parking lot, where the team will begin its travel just steps from the locker room ... Speaking of the locker room, the fully-appointed lounge area is outfitted with a sound system, 62" flat screen television, refrigerator and computer workstations ... The complex also features a classroom with video and dry-erase boards ... The locker room itself is spacious, with video screens and large, individual lockers with extra storage space ... Immediately behind the practice gym is a large patio area. This area will be used for social events and tailgating functions.



## Close Games

The Hokies are 34-36 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points ... Tech was 8-8 in such games last season ... The 16 games decided by five-or-fewer points or in overtime last season led the ACC ... Three conference wins came in overtime against nationally ranked teams last season ... Tech was 2-10 in such games in the 2005-06 season, with 10 games being decided in the final seconds of action ... Tech's first four losses last season were by a total of eight points and two (Xavier and Wisconsin) came with less than one second on the clock.

## In the Cassell

The Hokies have a 481-144 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .770 winning percentage ... The Hokies are 1-0 in Cassell Coliseum this season ... The Hokies were 10-6 in the Cassell last season and 14-3 in Cassell Coliseum during the 2007-08 season ... The win over Florida State in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Providence, 69-64, on Feb. 23, 2003, for the Hokies' 400th victory in the building ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech is now in its 49th season in Cassell ... The first basketball game was played in the Coliseum on Jan. 3, 1962, with the Hokies routing Alabama, 91-67 ... On Sept. 17, 1977, Tech dedicated the Coliseum in honor of the late Stuart K. Cassell ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum.

## We Love the 90s

When Virginia Tech defeated Duquesne, 116-108 in double overtime on March 18, 2009, it marked the 10th time under **Seth Greenberg** that Tech has scored 90-or-more points in a game ... The Hokies are 10-1 in those games ... Tech is 10-0 as an ACC team when scoring 90 points in a game and 232-21 all-time when scoring 90-or-more points in a game ... Tech's all-time high in an ACC game was a 94-88 regulation win against #1 North Carolina on Jan. 13, 2007 in Cassell Coliseum.

## Lights, Camera, Hokies

Tech is 65-69 on television under **Seth Greenberg** ... The Hokies were 15-15 in televised games last season ... Tech is scheduled to make at least 19 television appearances this season ... The Hokies made a school-record 30 appearances last season and made a then-school-record 26 television appearances the year before ... All 16 ACC regular season games last season were televised, for the first time since joining the league in 2004.

The win over Longwood on Dec. 14, 2008 was the Hokies' first game of the season against an in-state school ... The game against Longwood was the first-ever between the two schools ... The Hokies have now played 13 schools from the state ... The only other state Division I schools that Tech has not played are Norfolk State and Hampton... Tech is 413-302 (.578) all-time against schools from Virginia and was 3-1 against in-state schools last year ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech will play a total of four regular season games against schools from the Commonwealth ... Tech is 18-12 against schools from Virginia under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech is scheduled to play four games against Virginia schools this season.

Winning is contagious and, at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Now entering his seventh season as the head coach of the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 321-255 and a 108-85 record in six seasons at Virginia Tech. His biggest victories as the head coach of the Hokies include a 70-69 win at No. 12 Georgia Tech and a 67-65 victory against No. 7 Duke in Cassell Coliseum in the 2004-05 season. But in the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During this past season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson should be added to the list.

The 2008-09 season saw many highlights, most notably a 78-71 victory at No. 1 Wake Forest on Jan. 21. In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 2-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech made

its third consecutive post-season appearance and its fourth in Greenberg's six years in Blacksburg.

As the school year began, the Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

Since the end of last season, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. Also during the summer, Greenberg was notified that he would be inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum on April 18, 2010.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2009-10 season dawns, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The *Richmond Times-Dispatch* named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excite-

ment to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation."

Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university, while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie Nation."

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a four-year letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later,

where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated

four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and guest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the

chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Page, 21, Ella, 18, and Jacqueline, 14. Paige is a senior at Virginia Tech, and Ella is a freshman cheerleader for the Hokies. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.
