About Tonight's Game

Virginia Tech is 14-11 on the season and 3-7 in ACC play.
Florida State is 17-7 overall and 8-2 in ACC action.
FSU is ranked 20th in the AP poll and 21st in the coaches poll.

The Win Against Boston College

The Hokies defeated Boston College, 66-65, in Cassell Coliseum on Sunday evening.
Dorian Finney-Smith tipped in a shot with 2.4 seconds remaining to earn the win for the Hokies.
Finney-Smith led Tech with 17 points and eight rebounds. **Dorenzo Hudson** scored 11 points and
Erick Green and **Victor Davila** scored 10 points each in the win.

Seth Greenberg is one of 48 coaches participating in the Infiniti Coaches' Charity Challenge.

Green Notes

Erick Green's streak of 26 straight games with double-figures scoring is currently the longest among ACC players.
Green's 24 points off the bench in the win at Rhode Island is the second-most points by an ACC substitute this season. **Robert Brown's** 19 points off the bench against Monmouth is tops among ACC freshmen.

Greenberg Facts

Seth Greenberg is 168-117 (.589) at Virginia Tech and 381-287 (.570) in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach. Greenberg is 110-36 (.753) as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum.
In the win over Clemson, Greenberg passed former Virginia head coach Jeff Jones into 20th place in career ACC coaching wins (including both ACC regular season and tournament wins).

Interesting Side Notes

Of Virginia Tech's 11 active scholarship players, only three had seen meaningful action in previous seasons and five players are true freshmen.
Virginia Tech leads the ACC in free throw percentage, both overall and in league games.

Davila Notes

Victor Davila is shooting 54.0 percent from the field for his career. If he had enough made field goals to qualify, that would be tied for fourth on the Virginia Tech all-time list.
Over the last nine games, Davila is 18-of-24 from the free throw line, good for 75.0 percent.

Last Time Out: VT 66, BC 65

The Hokies defeated Boston College, 66-65, in Cassell Coliseum on Sunday evening ...

Dorian Finney-Smith tipped in a rebound with 2.4 second remaining to give Tech a 66-65 lead and the Hokies held off a final BC shot for the win ... Finney-Smith led the Hokies with 17 points and eight rebounds ...

Dorenzo Hudson scored 11 points and **Erick Green** and **Victor Davila** scored 10 points each ... Tech out rebounded the Eagles, 33-19, including an 18-4 edge on the offensive glass ... Tech's bench outscored BC's, 32-5.

The Series vs. Florida State

The Seminoles hold a 26-19 advantage against Virginia Tech in the all-time series ... FSU won the last meeting, 63-59, in Blacksburg in January ... Tech is 5-15 in road games in the series and 4-13 in the Donald Tucker Center ... The Hokies are 4-7 against FSU since joining the ACC and 3-7 in ACC regular season games ... Tech is 15-19 against FSU in all conference games, including Metro Conference games ... Along with Blacksburg and Tallahassee, the two teams have met in Roanoke, Louisville and Memphis.

Green Extends His Streak

With his 10 points in the win over Boston College, **Erick Green** currently has scored in double-figures in all 23 games that he has played this season and in 26 consecutive games over the last two seasons ... That is the longest active streak of double-figure games among ACC players ... Green missed the season-opening win over ETSU this year with a strained achilles tendon and did not play at Boston College due to a knee injury ... The last Virginia Tech player to record at least 26 consecutive double figure scoring games was Malcolm Delaney, who recorded 32 consecutive games in double figures, beginning with 15 points in the win over Miami in the quarterfinals of the 2008 ACC Tournament in Charlotte and ending the next year on with eight points at Duke on Feb. 8, 2009.

More Points on Green

In the loss at Miami, **Erick Green** scored his 800th career point ... Green only scored 88 points as a freshman, but is quickly approaching the 1,000 career-point mark ... He currently has 814 career points.

Hokies in NCAA Stats

In the current NCAA statistics, Virginia Tech is fifth in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense and is 32nd in free throw percentage. (*As of 2-13-12*).

Davila Stepping Up

Victor Davila has had a vastly improved in the last seven games ... Over that stretch, he is 26-of-38 from the field, shooting 68.4 percent from the floor ... He is averaging 9.4 points and 5.4 rebounds per game (both higher than his season average) ... He has also made 14-of-19 free throw attempts, shooting 73.7 percent from the line.

A Big Time Performance

Dorian Finney-Smith has shown a return to form over the last three games for the Hokies ... In the win over Boston College, DFS led the Hokies with 17 points and eight rebounds, but no rebound and basket was bigger than his tip-in of a missed shot with 2.4 seconds remaining to give the Hokies the lead for good and the victory ... In the win against Clemson, DFS scored 12 points and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds ... He hit two, three-point field goals, one more than he had made in the previous seven league games, combined ... His 12 points equaled his total points in the first seven ACC contests of the year ... DFS grabbed a team-high eight rebounds in the loss at Miami ... He is averaging 11.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in the last three contests.

Owning the Glass

In the win over Boston College, the Hokies out rebounded BC, 33-19 ... The 14-rebound difference was the most for the Hokies since the win at Oklahoma State on New Year's Eve and the most against an ACC opponent since the home win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 13, 2011 ... The 19 total rebounds for BC was the fewest by a Hokie opponent since joining the ACC.

Win 10

With Virginia Tech's win over Boston College, it marked the ninth straight season that the Hokies have won at least 10 home games ... Tech's longest streak of 10-or-more home victories is 11 consecutive seasons, from 1975-76 through the 1985-86 season.

Hot at the Charity Stripe

The Hokies are shooting 74.6 percent from the free throw line ... Tech set the school record for free throw percentage in the 1980-81 season, at 75.0 percent from the line ... Tech made its first 13 free throw attempts in the win over Clemson.

A New Way to Choose

Seth Greenberg told the media following the win over Boston College that he had chosen that game's starting line-up by selecting the five players that had practiced the hardest in the team's final practice before the BC game ... He also stated that that would continue to be the way that he selects future startling line-ups ... He said this is a way to reward players for their efforts in practice.

Barksdale Injury Report

In the win over Boston College, **C.J. Barksdale** earned his first collegiate start, due to his work in practice the day prior to the game ... Unfortunately, Barksdale was limited to just 12 minutes of action after spraining his left ankle grabbing an offensive rebound ... He is receiving treatment from the Virginia Tech Sports Medicine staff and will continually evaluated ... He will most likely be a game-time decision for the Florida State game.

Thursdays

Tonight marks the third consecutive week that the Hokies have played on a Thursday night, the first time that has happened since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... It is the fourth of five Thursday ACC games this season, the most Thursday games since joining the league.

Hudson Reaches 1,100 Points

In the Hokies' win at Oklahoma State on New Year's Eve, redshirt senior guard Dorenzo Hudson became the 42nd player in Virginia Tech history to score 1,000 points in his career ... Hudson hit a three-pointer with 8:34 remaining in the game to give Tech a three-point lead, for his 1,000th point ... Hudson joins former teammates Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen, A.D. Vassallo and Deron Washington on the list ... In the win over Clemson, Hudson surpassed 1,100 career points ... Hudson currently has 1,122 career points, 35th on the Virginia Tech all-time scoring list ... He passed Brian Chase into 35th place in the win over Boston College.

Close Games

The Hokies are 51-50 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points ... Tech is 4-6 in such games this season.



Brown in a Giving Mood

In the first 17 games of the season, **Robert Brown** had recorded 28 assists, for an average of 1.6 assists per game ... Since the North Carolina game, Brown has dished out 23 assists in eight games, for an average of 2.9 assists per game.

Lots of Youth

Among Virginia Tech's 11 active scholarship players, the Hokies have three seniors, one junior, two sophomores and five freshmen ... The two sophomores had seen a combined 481 minutes of playing time up until this season ... Neither had ever started a game or played many minutes of meaningful ACC action ... Add to the fact that **Dorenzo Hudson** had missed the majority of last season and this team becomes an extremely inexperienced total group ... One senior, **Joey Racer**, was a walk-on that earned a scholarship for the second semester and did not play last season.

Seth Loves the Cassell

Seth Greenberg is 110-36 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .753 ... His record in 22 years as a head coach is 381-287 (.570) and is 168-117 (.589) in his ninth season at Virginia Tech ... Greenberg is 67-11 (.859) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

Building Makes it Better?

A case can be made that the Hokies have shown marked improvement in many areas of their game since moving into the Hahn Hurst Basketball practice facility in August 2009 ... One such improvement comes to the forefront ... In the six years before the opening of the practice facility, the Hokies shot a combined 66.2 percent from the free throw line ... Since the opening of the facility, the Hokies are shooting 72.1 percent from the free throw line.

Starting Line-Ups

In the win over Boston College, the Hokies used their seventh different starting line-up of the season ... Tech used just two different starting line-ups last season ... The last time Tech used more than seven different starting line-ups in a season was 11 line-ups during the 2008-09 season.

We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 295 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has had nine games with only one three-pointer under **Seth Greenberg**.

Green on the Rise

Last season, after **Erick Green** took over the starting point guard duties for the Hokies in the ninth game of the season, he recorded three games of 20-or-more-points ... He has already matched that total in just the first 16 games of this season ... Last year, he averaged 11.6 points per game; this season his average is now at 15.7 ppg ... He also is shooting better from the field, the three-point arc and the free throw line this season, along with averaging 50 percent more rebounds and a half more assists ... Green scored 370 points all of last season; he has scored 356 points already this season ... Green is the only player in the ACC in the top 10 in scoring, assists and steals.

500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 517-155 overall record in the Cassell, good for a .769 winning percentage ... Tech is 10-5 this season and was 12-4 in Cassell last season, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

Raising That Number

Dorenzo Hudson began the season as a 74.6 percent career free throw shooter ... So far this season, Hudson is 76-90 from the line, good for 84.4 percent ... He has raised his career percentage to 77.4 percent from the line ... Hudson is currently 39th nationally in free throw percentage.

Hokies' All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is now 1341-1103 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .549 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 103rd season of men's basketball.

A First for Jarell

Jarell Eddie had a career-best night in the BYU game on Jan. 25 ... Eddie recorded his first career double-double in the game, scoring 12 points and pulling down a career-high 14 rebounds ... He also added a career-high-tying five assists ... This marked the second consecutive game that Eddie grabbed double-figure rebounds, as he had a career-high 10 boards in the win at #15 Virginia.

Thompson to Miss 2011-12 Season

Senior forward **JT Thompson**, who missed the entire 2010-11 season following surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee, will miss the 2011-12 season with the same injury to his right knee ... The injury occurred during practice on Nov. 2.

JT Makes the Walk

Across the stage, that is ... On Dec. 16, just hours before the Hokies defeated Campbell, **JT Thompson** walked across the stage right here in Cassell Coliseum to accept his diploma in sociology ... Congratulations to JT on this achievement.

Lights, Camera, Hokies

Tech is 101-101 on television under **Seth Greenberg** ... The Hokies were 16-11 last season and are 6-10 this season ... All the rest of the Hokies' games this season are televised ... The Hokies made a school-record 30 appearances in the 2008-09 season and made a then-school record 26 television appearances the year before ... Tech is 7-3 in internet streamed games.

End of Game Heroics

Beginning with the North Carolina game on Jan. 19, **Dorenzo Hudson** has been coming off the bench to provide the Hokies a spark ... In the five games since then, he is averaging 12.4 points per game and has hit seven of 12 three-point field goal attempts ... In the Hokies' 47-45 victory at #15/17 Virginia on Jan. 22, Hudson scored the Hokies' final five points of the game and six of Tech's last eight points ... With less than 17 seconds remaining, Hudson hit a big three-pointer from the left corner to give Tech a four point lead ... Then, on the defensive end, Hudson made a diving steal attempt in the final second to disrupt the UVa offense.

High Points With Low Points

The Hokies defeated #15/17 Virginia, 47-45, on Jan. 22 in Charlottesville ... The 45 points allowed is the fewest points Tech has ever allowed in an ACC regular season game ... The previous low was 48 points scored by Boston College, in a 67-48, Tech win in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 26, 2008 ... The fewest points Tech has allowed an ACC opponent since joining the league was a 59-43 Virginia Tech win over Georgia Tech in last season's ACC Tournament ... The Hokies' 47 points at Virginia is the lowest point total for the Hokies ever in an ACC victory ... The last time the Hokies won any game while scoring 47-or-fewer points was a 45-43 win over George Washington on Feb. 4, 1997 in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech has only won three games in the last 50 years in which they have scored 47-or-fewer points ... The win at #15/17 Virginia is Tech's first win over a nationally-ranked team in which Tech scored fewer than 50 points.

The First Freshman

Dorian Finney-Smith accomplished something in the win over ETSU that has not happened in Blacksburg for quite some time ... His double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds is the first time a Hokie freshman has accomplished that feat in their collegiate debut since Nov. 9, 2007, when Jeff Allen scored 19 points and had 10 rebounds against Elon ... Allen was the first since Dale Solomon accomplished that feat with 23 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Buffalo State in 1978 ... The last time a Tech freshman had at least 16 rebounds in any game was Ace Custis, who grabbed 16 rebounds against VMI on Dec. 9, 1993 ... Finney-Smith added his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over FIU and recorded No. 3 with 10 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Oklahoma State in Madison Square Garden.

What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

They're Free, Aren't They

In the win over FIU, **Dorenzo Hudson** hit all 12 of his free throw attempts ... That is a new career high for perfect free throw shooting in a game for Hudson and is the first game that a Hokie made at least 10 free throws in a game and shot 1.000 since Malcolm Delaney hit 14 of 14 from the line against Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011 ... This is the first time that Hudson has ever made all of his free throw attempts in a game and made 10-or-more free throws ... Hudson made 20-of-21 free throws in the win against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010 in Cancun, Mexico, a game in which Hudson scored a career-high 41 points.

He is in school and will graduate from Virginia Tech this summer.

13 Threes

Virginia Tech made a season-high 13 three-pointers in the loss to #8/8 North Carolina on Jan. 19 ... It is the second time this season that Tech has reached double-figures in three-point field goals in a game, surpassing the 10 made threes in the season-opening win over ETSU ... It is also the most three-pointers made by the Hokies since joining the ACC and the most since Tech hit a school-record 16 three-pointers in a home loss to Marquette on Jan. 7, 1989.

Going Green

Erick Green was one of the most improved players in the ACC last season ... In the 26 games after he stepped into the starting line-up, Green had a great assist/turnover ratio ... In that span, he had 82 assists and just 35 turnovers ... He had 31 assists as a freshman in the 2009-10 season ... After entering the starting line-up in the win over Penn State last season, Green had eight games in which he did not commit a turnover, including the entire month of December (six games in which he had 15 assists and 0 turnovers) ... He has 63 assists and 37 turnovers this season.

A Lot to Lose

Graduation cost the Hokies two of the most prolific players in school history, plus a two-year starter, Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen and Terrell Bell ... Tech lost 63.3 percent of its scoring from last season, along with 63.8 percent of its assists, 61.9 percent of its rebounds and 58.4 percent of its minutes played ... That trio of players combined for 4,534 points and 2,106 rebounds in their careers at Virginia Tech.

Tech, UVa and #15

With the win at #15 Virginia on Jan. 22, Virginia Tech is now 2-5 all-time against teams ranked #15 in the AP poll ... Tech's only other win against a 15th-ranked team was a 59-53 win over Virginia in the Richmond Coliseum on Jan. 30, 1993.

On Jan. 10, 13 and 16 of 2010, Tech played three straight games against #9 UNC (78-64 road loss), #23 Miami (81-66 home win) and #25 Florida State (63-58 road loss).

Versus the Best

Seth Greenberg entered this season with four career wins against No. 1-ranked teams and three of those have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004 ... The three ACC wins against No. 1-ranked teams (all three opponents were ACC foes) ranks Greenberg tied for sixth among all-time ACC coaches ... The three victories are tied for third (with Florida State's Leonard Hamilton) among current ACC coaches.

Hudson Honored by ACC

Virginia Tech guard **Dorenzo Hudson** was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 20, 2011 ... Hudson, a redshirt senior from Charlotte, N.C., averaged 24.5 points and 2.5 assists in wins over Monmouth and FIU ... In the 78-63 win over FIU, he was eight-of-13 from the floor and a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line en route to scoring an ACC season-high 31 points in a victory that advanced the Hokies to the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off.

The Hokies are planning on seeking a medical redshirt on freshman forward **Joey van Zegeren** ... He suffered a concussion earlier this season and has had other concussion-like issues.

Tech returns to Cassell Coliseum on Saturday afternoon to face Georgia Tech ... The game will tip-off at 3 p.m. and will be broadcast by regional sports networks.

Notes From the Win Over EMU

In the Hokies' win over Eastern Michigan, Tech held the Eagles to just nine points in the first half ... That is the fewest points allowed in a half by the Hokies since at least 2000 ... It also marked the second-fewest points allowed by a team in a Division I game this season ... Wisconsin allowed Kennesaw State just eight points in the first half of their game on Nov. 12 in Madison ... Tech held the Eagles to just 28.1 percent from the field, including 14.3 percent in the first half ... That marks the third time this season that the Hokies have held an opponent under 30 percent from the field this season.

Hostile Crowds

The announced crowd of 12,528 at Kansas State last season was the largest crowd to witness a Virginia Tech non-conference away or neutral site game since Dec. 21, 2006, when the Hokies defeated Seton Hall, 80-61, in Madison Square Garden in front of 19,528 ... The last time the Hokies played in front of a larger crowd on a non-conference opponent's home court was Nov. 28, 2005, when the Hokies fell to Ohio State in the Shottenstein Center in front of an announced crowd of 13,218 ... Tech's 67-61 victory at Oklahoma State on Dec. 31, 2011 was in front of a crowd of 12,500.

That's an Improvement

Virginia Tech's **Jarell Eddie** is fourth in the ACC in improved scoring from last year ... As a freshman, Eddie averaged just 2.9 points per game ... This season, he has improved to 9.5 points per game ... That +6.6 ppg trails only Terrell Stoglin of Maryland (+10.2), C.J. Williams of NC State (+7.5) and C.J. Harris of Wake Forest (+7.2).

Virginia Tech is 420-304 (.580) all-time against schools from Virginia ...Tech is 2-0 against state schools this year and was 1-2 against state schools last season ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over Norfolk State on Dec. 11, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech is 25-14 against schools from Virginia under **Seth Greenberg**.

Hot Shooting

In the win over Monmouth, the Hokies shot 62.5 percent from the field ... That is the highest single-game percentage for the Hokies since a 69.2 percent performance in the win over Mount St. Mary's last season ... Tech was 66.7 percent from three-point range ... That is the highest single-game percentage since shooting 66.7 percent from three-point range in the win at Wake Forest last season ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 66.7 percent from three-point territory was 68.8 percent against Wisconsin on Dec. 1, 2008 ... Tech followed that with a 51.9 percent shooting night in the win over FIU ... That marks the first time since the wins over Wake Forest and Maryland (on Jan. 15 and 20, 2011) that the Hokies have recorded back-to-back games of better than 50 percent shooting from the field ... In the win over Clemson, Seth Greenberg moved past former Virginia head coach Jeff Jones into 20th place on the all-time ACC wins list, with 65 victories. This includes ACC regular season and tournament games.

Raines Makes the Most of His Time

Cadarian Raines was limited to just 12 minutes of action in the win over Oklahoma State in Madison Square Garden, but the sophomore post made the most of his minutes ... He grabbed a then-career-high nine rebounds in that time and also blocked three Cowboy shots ... In the Hokies' win at Rhode Island, Raines recorded a new career-high, as he scored 12 points in the win ... He also had a career-high with three steals ... He was six of eight from the field and grabbed four rebounds ... In the win over Norfolk State, Raines scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds, six on the offensive glass and he grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds in the win over North Florida, while also adding three blocked shots ... Raines continued his strong play on Dec. 22, as he scored 10 points and had four rebounds in 16 minutes of action in the win over Eastern Michigan ... He also made all four of his free throw attempts.

Head Coach Seth Greenberg



Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. In his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course

of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 381-287, now in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach and a 168-117 record in his ninth season at Virginia Tech. Since coming to Blacksburg, Greenberg's Hokies have three wins over No. 1 ranked teams, including, most recently, a 64-60 victory over top-ranked Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 3-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made five consecutive post-season appearances and six in

Greenberg's eight years in Blacksburg.

The Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility in August 2009. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the past few years, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The Richmond Times-Dispatch named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation." Perhaps the

biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie Nation."

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a four-year letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later, where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped

revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and guest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved

in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

This past season, Greenberg took on a leadership role with "Shots from the

Heart," an event that helped the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event featured selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 16. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2010 and Ella will be a junior cheerleader for the Hokies in the fall of 2011. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.

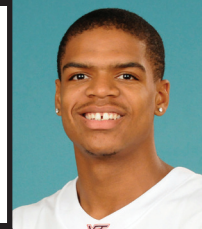

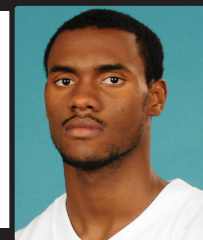

Punching its ticket to New York City, Virginia Tech earned a spot in the NIT Season Tip-Off Semifinals with a 78-63 win over Florida International in the second round of the tournament at Cassell Coliseum. But Tech opened the second half by hitting six of its first seven shots, as **Jarell Eddie** heated up following a scoreless first half. Eddie scored seven of Tech's 15 points in that run, and his basket with 15:19 left in the game capped the run, giving the Hokies a 47-29 lead.

Tech continued its hot shooting throughout the second half. The Hokies shot 73.1 percent in the final 20 minutes and 54.7 percent for the game – its second-best shooting performance of the season.

In contrast, Campbell struggled from the floor in the first five minutes of the second half. The Fighting Camels missed three shots and turned the ball over four times on their first seven possessions of the second half. Their first basket in the final 20 minutes came at the 14:46 mark, and Campbell shot just 41.9 percent in the second half (44.1 for the game).

Dorenzo Hudson and **Victor Davila** both snapped shooting slumps for Tech, leading the Hokies in scoring with 15 points each. Hudson hit 5-of-11 from the floor, including 2-of-4 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Dorenzo Hudson scored 16 points to help Virginia Tech win its fourth straight game in an 84-55 decision over North Florida in non-conference action.

The Hokies broke open a close contest with an 8-0 run to close the first half. **Jarell Eddie's** 3-pointer with 3 seconds left – his only points of the half – gave Tech a 40-31 halftime lead.

Tech used a 19-5 run over a 7-minute stretch in the second half to put the game away. **Erick Green** and **Robert Brown** combined to score 13 of the 19 points in that run for the Hokies. Tech went on to lead by as many as 29 points in the game and shot 61.3 percent in the final 20 minutes (19 of 31).

North Florida, which has played a brutal schedule that includes Alabama, Florida, Miami, Ohio State and Kansas State, struggled to take care of the ball against Tech's man-to-man defense. The Ospreys committed 16 turnovers, and they shot just 37.5 percent from the floor in the second half.

Hudson, who snapped out of a shooting slump in the Hokies' previous game against Campbell, connected on 6 of 10 from the floor to pace a Tech team that shot 55.2 percent for the game (32 of 58). It marked the fifth time this season that the Hokies have shot better than 50 percent.

Brown added 14 points for the Hokies, hitting 6 of 10 from the floor, including 2 of 4 from beyond the 3-point arc. **Dorian Finney-Smith** also had 14 and hit two 3-pointers, as the Hokies made seven treys for the game. Green finished with 12.

The Hokies head into the Christmas holiday having won five straight games and now take eight days off before a New Year's Eve date at Oklahoma State.

Tech put things away in this one by finishing the first half with a 16-0 run and then scoring the first six points of the second half for a 22-0 burst spanning both halves. Eastern Michigan's Kamil Janton scored with 11:22 left in the first half to cut the Virginia Tech lead to 11-9, but Green started the Hokies' run with a free throw at the 7:06 mark. The Hokies' point guard scored half of Virginia Tech's final 16 first-half points, as the Hokies took a 27-9 lead at the break.

Eastern Michigan, playing its sixth straight road game – which has included trips to Syracuse and Purdue – made just three shots in the first half and missed its final 10 shots. Cadarian Raines added 10 points for the Hokies, while **Robert Brown** finished with nine. **C.J. Barksdale** had a game-high 10 rebounds.

Bernard James enjoyed a great night to lead FSU. The 6-foot-10 senior scored 18 points, grabbed 15 rebounds and blocked three shots. Miller added 15 points for the Seminoles.

FSU finished with a season-high 15 blocked shots, tying for the most blocked shots ever by a Tech opponent against the Hokies – the Georgetown Hoyas, featuring then sophomore Dikembe Mutombo and freshman Alonzo Mourning, blocked 15 in a win over the Hokies in 1988. The Seminoles also held the Hokies to a season-low 30.5 percent from the floor.

Green scored 21 of the Hokies' 59 points, hitting 5 of 14 from the floor and all 10 of his free-throw attempts. **Dorian Finney-Smith** had nine points and 10 rebounds.

Virginia Tech made eight 3-pointers in the first half and led at halftime, but the Hokies couldn't continue the hot shooting, and North Carolina ran away to an 82-68 ACC victory over Tech at Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night.

The loss marked Tech's fourth straight, as the Hokies fell to 11-7, 0-4 in the league. North Carolina, ranked No. 8 in both major polls, moved to 16-3, 3-1 in the ACC.

Behind **Dorenzo Hudson**, Tech drilled eight 3-pointers in the first half, with the senior guard canning four of them. As a result, the Hokies were able to take a 39-34 lead at halftime.

But the Tar Heels took control early in the second half. Trailing 44-36, North Carolina went on a 19-0 run and never looked back. **Dorian Finney-Smith** ended the run with two free throws at the 13:08 mark, but the Hokies didn't score again until **Robert Brown** drained a 3-pointer with 9:25 remaining. By then, Tech trailed by 13, 62-49.

North Carolina went on to lead by as many as 21, thanks largely to the play of Harrison Barnes. The sophomore scored a game-high 27 points, with 21 of those coming in the second half. John Henson and Tyler Zeller finished with double-doubles, as Henson scored 16 points and grabbed 16 rebounds and Zeller added 14 points and grabbed 11 boards.

The Tar Heels shot 51.7 percent in the second half and finished at 45.5. In contrast, the Hokies shot 33.3 percent in the second half and finished at 36.8 percent for the game.

Erick Green led the Hokies with 17 points, while Hudson – who did not start for the first time this season – came off the bench to score 16. **Jarell Eddie** added 15 and Brown, who started in Hudson's place, had 12.

UVA cut the lead to 47-45 with a second remaining after a Joe Harris basket. The Cavaliers fouled Tech's **Robert Brown** before any time ran off the clock, but Brown missed the front end of a one-and-one, giving UVA one last chance.

Coming out of a timeout, Harris tried to throw a length-of-the-court pass to Scott, but he threw it too far and the pass went off Scott's hand out of bands. Tech then ran out the clock to seal things.

Green paced the Hokies with 15 points, while Hudson came off the bench for the second straight game and scored 12. He scored 16 in Tech's previous game against North Carolina.

Three Virginia players scored 10 points each – Scott, Harris and Evans – but the Cavaliers were victimized by poor shooting, both from the field and from the free-throw line. UVA shot 32.6 percent from the floor and 63.6 percent from the free-throw line.

With the loss, Tech fell to 12-10 on the season, 1-6 in the ACC. Duke, ranked No. 7 in The Associated Press poll and No. 5 in the coaches' poll, moved to 19-3, 6-1 in league play.

Davila, a senior from Puerto Rico, tied a career-high 16 points for Tech, hitting six of his seven shots from the floor and four of his six free-throw attempts. He also grabbed seven rebounds.

Erick Green paced Tech with 17 points, hitting 6 of 12 from the floor, and he also grabbed seven boards. He and Davila were the only two Tech players in double figures.

Virginia Tech's **Jarell Eddie** scored 15 points, and the Hokies withstood a furious Clemson rally down the stretch, holding off the Tigers 67-65 in an ACC game played Saturday afternoon at Cassell Coliseum.

With the win, Tech moved to 13-10 overall, 2-6 in the ACC. Clemson fell to 11-11, 3-5 in the league.

Tech seemed to have the game in control, leading 64-50 following a **Dorian Finney-Smith** 3-pointer from the corner with 5:57 remaining. But the Tigers used pressure defense to get back in the game, going on a 15-3 run and cutting the Tech lead to 67-65 on a jumper by Tanner Smith with 27 seconds left in the game.

Clemson then fouled **Victor Davila** with 24 seconds left, but Davila missed the front end of a one-and-one, giving the Tigers the ball with a chance to tie or win it. The Tigers called a timeout with 11 seconds left and got the ball into the hands of K.J. McDaniels, who was fouled by Eddie while driving to the basket with 3.3 seconds to go.

McDaniels, who was shooting less than 60 percent from the free-throw line going into this game, missed the first free throw. He intentionally missed the second one, and a tipped ball found its way into the hands of Tigers forward Tanner Smith. Smith launched a short baseline jumper as time expired that bounced off the rim, enabling the Hokies to escape with the win.

Tech did not score from the floor in the final 5:57, but Eddie's 15 points and a slump-busting game from Finney-Smith were enough to lift the Hokies. Finney-Smith scored in double figures for the first time since the Hokies' victory over North Florida on Dec. 19. He finished with 12 points on 6 of 8 shooting from the floor and he also grabbed eight rebounds.

McDaniels and Andre Young scored 14 points each to lead the Tigers, who were plagued by poor shooting throughout and hit just 37.9 percent for the game. Devin Booker had a double-double, with 11 points and 11 rebounds, and Smith added 10 points.

Virginia Tech's **Dorian Finney-Smith** tipped in a **Robert Brown** missed 3-pointer with 1.8 seconds left to lift the Hokies past Boston College 66-65 in an ACC game played Sunday night at Cassell Coliseum.

Finney-Smith scored 17 points and grabbed eight rebounds, but none more important than his last one and the last of Tech's 18 offensive boards for the evening.

After BC's Jordan Daniels missed the front end of a 1-and-1 with 26.2 seconds remaining, Tech called a timeout with 10.1 seconds left, and the Hokies got the ball to Erick Green, who drove down the lane and threw it to Brown. The sophomore launched a 3-pointer at the top of the key with four seconds left that bounced off the rim, but Finney-Smith tipped it in to give the Hokies a one-point lead.

BC called a timeout after Finney-Smith's tip-in for a final attempt. Lonnie Jackson took a long 3-pointer just inside of the halfcourt line that was off the mark, and Tech prevailed.

Greenberg started freshman C.J. Barksdale for the first time this season and inserted guard Dorenzo Hudson back into the starting lineup. Hudson had come off the bench the previous seven games – with the Hokies going 2-5 in that stretch – but he carried the Hokies down the stretch against BC, scoring all 11 of his points in the final 10 minutes.

The Eagles lost despite shooting a season-high 55.8 percent from the floor (24 of 43) – and easily the best by a Tech opponent this season. The Hokies had allowed just one team to shoot better than 50 percent all season.

Ryan Anderson led BC with 17 points, and Jackson finished with 14.

Green extended his streak of scoring in double figures to 26 games with 10 points. Victor Davila also scored 10 for Tech.
