Weekend Headlines

- ♦ Virginia Tech opens its sixth season of ACC competition this weekend, taking on NC State in a three-game set in Raleigh.
- ♦ Tech is 55-40 in ACC play in the previous five seasons, winning the conference tournament title twice (2007, 2008).
- ♦ The Hokies are 8-7 all-time against NC State and 48-27 in the state of North Carolina.

About NC State

NC State features a high-powered offense that has already clocked 29 round trippers heading into Thursday's doubleheader as the Wolfpack stands at 16-9 overall.

Landon Warren leads the way with a .373 batting average while Stephanie Call is hitting .347 with nine home runs and 24 RBI. Three others have three home runs for an offense that hits .265.

In the circle, the Hokies will see a heavy dose of Lindsay Campana, who sports a stellar 0.56 ERA. She is 10-3 with 138 strikeouts in just 88.0 innings. Call is 5-1 with a 2.85 ERA and the staff as a whole has a 1.98 ERA.

The Series

Virginia Tech and NC State have met 15 times prior to this upcoming weekend with the Hokies holding a slim 8-7 lead. The series began in 2005 when Tech joined the ACC and the 'Pack swept that first series in Blacksburg. The next year, NC State took two of three in Raleigh and then beat the Hokies in the ACC Tournament.

In 2007, the Hokies won the series 2-1 in Blacksburg and have won five in a row to take the lead in the series. In 2008, Tech swept the 'Pack in Raleigh and then beat them 2-0 in the ACC Championship game. Last year's series was rained out. Tech is 5-1 against NCSU in Raleigh.

Fifteen Years of VTSB

This season will be a special one as it marks the 15th year of the program. Started in 1996 with a young coach and a group of anxious ballplayers not knowing what to expect, the program has evolved into a contender year-in and year-out, capped by an appearance in the Women's College World Series in 2008.

An Alumnae Weekend will be held next weekend when the Hokies host the University of Virginia to celebrate the anniversary. Any former player interested is encouraged to contact the Bryan Johnston at blj@vt.edu for more information.

Racking Up The Hotel Points

If the Hokies have the look of a road-weary team, it's because they are. Tech is on the road for the sixth straight weekend, having yet to play a home game and haven't spent the night in their home beds for more than three consecutive days since the season began.

The Hokies opened the season in Florida, played back-to-back weekends in Georgia, then spent 11 days together in Florida for Spring Break over a two weekend period.

Tech was supposed to have a home game Feb. 24 against Radford, but it was postponed because of snowy field conditions. The Hokies will try to open their home slate next week with a doubleheader against North Carolina A&T on Tuesday, a doubleheader against Hampton the next day, and a three-game ACC series against Virginia next weekend.

Banged Up and Bruised

The Hokies have been bitten by the injury bug early on, forcing major changes to the lineup. Misty Hall burst her bursa sac in Florida and hasn't played since and Richelle McGarva injured her shoulder and has only been able to hit.

Ashton Ward, a pitcher, has played shortstop and in left field, Kristina Cruz, a third baseman, has moved to shortstop, Whitney Davis has moved from right field to center field, Kristen Froehlich has moved to right field and Kelsey Hensel, a first baseman, has moved to third base.

So far this year, six different players have started at least one game at shortstop and six have started at least one in left field.

What's Your Name?

The Tech softball team will have quite a different look this year after graduating six seniors from last year's squad, while adding a bunch of new players.

The Hokies will have nine newcomers this year, seven of who are freshmen. Toss in Misty Hall, who returns after missing last year due to suspension, and 10 of the 19 players on this year's team weren't on the 2009 roster.

Hall Returns

Misty Hall, who missed the entire 2009 season after being suspended from the university, returns for the 2010 season after being reinstated. The senior from Dayton, Va., started all 68 games in 2008, hitting .241 with a team-leading seven home runs - including a walk-off solo shot in the regionals against Louisville - and 38 RBI with 17 stolen bases. The athletic

Hall will play primarily at shortstop once again, a place where she started 59 games as a sophomore, but can also catch.

Losing Hall last year had a trickle-down effect as she was slated to play shortstop and catch last year. In her absence, Erin Ota had to slide over to short, a position she had never played and at 5-2, wasn't exactly the prototypical size. The Hokies rotated three catchers behind the plate, two of whom came to Tech as walk-ons and used a true freshman most of the season at second base.

Hall was off to a hot start, but suffered a sprained left knee on a collision at the plate against Georgia on Feb. 19 and missed several games. She returned to play in the field at the Under Armour Invite, but sustained a different injury to the same knee and is questionable for this weekend.

Tough Schedule

Head coach Scot Thomas has put together yet another tough schedule this season, one that is highlighted by 21 scheduled games against 2009 NCAA Tournament teams such as Florida State (3), North Carolina (3), Radford (2), UMass (1), Nebraska (1), Chattanooga (1), Iowa (1), Auburn (1), Boston (1) and Illinois (1). The Hokies will also take on 2009 NCAA Super Regional squad Georgia Tech in a three-game ACC series and will also play three games against Georgia (2) and Missouri (1) - 2009 WCWS squads.

Ironically enough, the Hokies will face all four teams from last year's Atlanta Regional (Georgia Tech, Boston, Iowa and Auburn) and three of the four squads from the Chapel Hill Regional (UNC, Georgia and Radford).

Canadian Connection

Junior Richelle McGarva is the latest in the long line of Canadians to suit up for the Tech softball program. Starting with Michelle Johnson in 1997, McGarva is the eighth Canadian to migrate south to Blacksburg ... and they've all been from the province of British Columbia.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
 Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
 Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
 Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
 Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**



JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Home of the 2010 ACC Softball Championship

For the first time in the program's history, a conference tournament will be hosted at home in Blacksburg when the Atlantic Coast Conference Softball Championship is played at Tech Softball Park come May 14-16. Seven other teams will join the Hokies in Blacksburg in a single-elimination tournament to decide the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Tech served as host for the 1999 Atlantic 10 Softball Championship and the 2002 Big East Softball Championship, both played at the Moyer Complex in nearby Salem, but this will be the first conference tournament played at Tech Softball Park.

Tracking Tinch

After being named the National Player of the Year by USA Softball in 2008, former Hokie pitcher Angela Tinch has kept things rolling. In the summer of 2008, she was a standout for the Akron Racers and last year, she went to Japan for another adventure. She signed with LeoPalace 21 of the Japan Pro Softball League and competed there for three months before returning to the NPF last summer. She then headed back to Japan after the NPF season wrapped up to finish her stint across the seas where she helped her team to a top-four finish in the top division of pro softball. Currently, she is helping out as an assistant coach at Syracuse University while continuing to train.

Struggling At The Plate

After an opening five games which saw the Hokies hit .365 with four home runs, 44 RBI and post a 4-1 record, Tech's bats have gone silent. In the last 18 games (3-15), Tech is hitting just .180 with four home runs and 26 RBI.
