This Weekend's Headlines

- The Hokies are on a bit of a hot streak to end the season, winning five of their last six games.

- This will be the first time Tech has hosted a conference championship on campus. The Hokies hosted the 1999 Atlantic 10 Tournament and the 2002 Big East Tournament in Salem.

- No host team has won the ACC Championship since Florida State did it in 2004.

- The Hokies will play Virginia in the first round of the tournament. That game will take place on Friday at 2:30 p.m. Tech and UVa have met four previous times in the ACC Championship with both teams winning twice.
- The last time Tech was seeded seventh in the ACC Championship was in 2005 and the Hokies advanced to the title game.

ACC Tournament History

The Hokies have won two league titles, sweeping through four games at Tallahassee, Fla., in 2007 and then winning three games at College Park, Md., the following year en route to the Women's College World Series.

About Virginia

Tech and Virginia played a three-game series at Tech Softball Park in late March with the Cavs winning all three games.

The Cavaliers are led by stud freshman pitcher Melanie Mitchell, who boasts a 26-15 record on the year with a 2.75 ERA. She has 277 strikeouts but has thrown 259.2 innings this year, 74 percent of UVa's total innings played, and among the most in the country.

Offensively, Sarah Tacke leads the way with a .358 average and 10 home runs while Nicole Koren hits .314 with 12 home runs. Clara Kendall leads the way with 17 stolen bases, but hits just .250. The Cavs hit just .259 as a team with 34 home runs and 78 stolen bases.

Despite the sweep earlier this season, Virginia Tech still leads the series against Virginia 22-16.

Healthy At Last

April 28 night marked a big night for the Hokies as it was the first time since Feb. 19 that all 19 players were healthy and cleared to play. The last time all 19 were available was at the Red & Black Showcase in Athens, Ga., a span of 45 games.

Misty Hall (knee), Whitney Davis (knee), Richelle McGarva (shoulder), Kelsey Hensel (hand) and Courtney Liddle (shoulder) are all starters who missed time or were slowed by injury, but Hensel - who the last on the DL - was cleared that day and played an inning in left field.

What's Your Name?

The Tech softball team has quite a different look this year after graduating six seniors from last year's squad, while adding a bunch of new players.

Virginia Tech has nine newcomers this year, seven of who are freshmen to go along with two transfers. Toss in Misty Hall, who returned after missing last year due to suspension, and 10 of the 19 players on this year's team weren't on the 2009 roster.

Hall Returns

Misty Hall, who missed the entire 2009 season after being suspended from the university, returned for the 2010 season after being reinstated. The senior from Dayton, Va., started all 68 games in 2008, hitting .241 with a team-leading seven home runs and 38 RBI with 17 stolen bases. The athletic Hall has played at shortstop once again, a place where she started 59 games as a sophomore.

Losing Hall last year had a trickle-down effect as she was slated to play shortstop and catch last year. In her absence, Erin Ota had to slide over to short, a position she had never played and at 5-2, wasn't exactly the prototypical size. The Hokies rotated three catchers behind the plate, two of whom came to Tech as walk-ons and used a true freshman most of the season at second base.

Hall was off to a hot start, but suffered a sprained left knee on a collision at the plate against Georgia on Feb. 19 and missed several games. She returned to play in the field at the Under Armour Invite, but sustained a different injury to the same knee and missed two more weeks.

She's been swinging a hot bat of late, hitting eight home runs and batting .368 with 24 RBI over the past 21 games, including a three-run, game-tying shot against Florida State in the seventh inning - her second of the game - and a walk-off home run against the Seminoles in game two of that doubleheader. She was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on April 20 after hitting four home runs and batted .545.

Canadian Connection

Junior **Richelle McGarva** is the latest in the long line of Canadians to suit up for the Tech softball program. Starting with Michelle Johnson in 1997, McGarva is the eighth Canadian to migrate south to Blacksburg ... and they've all been from the province of British Columbia.

Tough Schedule

Head coach **Scot Thomas** put together yet another tough schedule this season, one that was highlighted by 20 games against 2009 NCAA Tournament teams such as Florida State (3), North Carolina (3), Radford (1), UMass (1), Nebraska (1), Chattanooga (1), Iowa (1), Auburn (1), Boston (1) and Illinois (1). The Hokies also took on 2009 NCAA Super Regional squad Georgia Tech in a three-game ACC series and also played three games against Georgia (2) and Missouri (1) - 2009 WCWS squads. Ironically enough, the Hokies faced all four teams from last year's Atlanta Regional (Georgia Tech, Boston, Iowa and Auburn) and three of the four squads from the Chapel Hill Regional (UNC, Georgia and Radford).

Double Your Pleasure

Virginia Tech leads the ACC with 19 double plays turned. It's the most double plays turned by the Hokies since turning a school-record 23 in 2001.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**



JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Double Your Fun

When Misty Hall hit a home run against Boston College in the final game of the regular season, it marked a historic round-tripper as it is the first time in program history Tech has had two players hit 10 or more home runs in the same season. Hall now has 10 and Courtney Liddle leads the way with a freshman-record 11.

Thrown Into the Fire

A pair of freshmen have been given the keys to the car at their respective position and have seen a ton of playing time in their first year on campus.

Courtney Liddle has started 47 games at catcher and has hit a Tech freshman record 11 home runs. Unfortunately, eight of them have been solo shots as she has just 20 RBI. She has thrown out 12 would-be base stealers and has taken control of the defense from behind the plate.

Bkaye Smith has started 55 games at second base and batted in the leadoff spot 39 times. Her average has dropped toward the end of the season, but she finished with a .263 average and 24 stolen bases. She has 13 multiple hit games this year, tied for the team lead.

Returning Strong

Richelle McGarva was off to a strong start in 2009 before an ankle injury sidelined her for the rest of the year. The former Canadian Junior National Team player has had a breakout 2010 campaign and has done it with one arm most of the season.

She is second on the team with a .291 average and is second with 31 RBI. She has five home runs, a team-leading 13 doubles, two triples and 14 stolen bases. She hurt her shoulder in preseason, but played through the pain before having her shoulder pop out twice more during the season. She moved from center field to designated player full time, but since making that move on April 10 for the Maryland series, she is batting .319 with three home runs and 10 RBI.

What a Way to Go Out

Whitney Davis entered her senior season as a career .218 hitter who was known more for her strong arm in right field. But she has had quite a final season, batting .333 with two home runs and 17 RBI, even though she missed nearly a month with a torn PCL. She suffered the injury on March 28 when her knee twisted awkwardly as she ran out of the batter's box on a wet field against Virginia. But she worked hard to get back to the field and hit .318 in the eight games she played in to end the regular season.
