Hokie Invites: Tech is looking for its third consecutive sweep of the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational. The Hokies defeated William & Mary (3-1), VCU (3-1) and Marshall (3-1) for the sweep in 2007. Playing in her first three matches as a Hokie, Felicia Willoughby was named to the All-Tournament team, and would go on to have one of the best rookie campaigns in school history. In 2006, Taylor Parrish earned MVP honors of the tournament, while the Hokies cruised to their first Hokie Invite title since 1998, beating George Washington (3-0), Liberty (3-1) and Appalachian State (3-2).

Scouting the Lady Hawks: The Lady Hawks are coming off a 24-4 season, 10-1 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, in 2007. The one loss came in the MEAC Championship, to perennial conference power Florida A&M. At one point last season, Maryland-Eastern Shore had won 23 matches in a row. UMES relied on their serve in 2007, leading the country with 2.84 aces per game. They were also consistent with a .248 hitting percentage, ranking 38th in the nation.

Scouting the Rams: Winston-Salem State is in its second year of the NCAA transition period after moving up to the Division I scene. The Rams went 4-26 last season, and return all but one starter, including Valentina Pushkina who led the team in assists (491) and digs (175).

Scouting the Chanticleers: Coastal Carolina finished 15-17 in 2007, with a 6-6 mark, and a fourth-place finish in the Big South. The Chanticleers, like the Rams, only lose one starter. Senior libero Brett Starbuck leads the team from the back row, after collecting 607 digs last season.

2008 SEASON SUPERLATIVES

Season Openers - The Hokies are 17-14 in season opening contests. Tech is 2-2 since joining the ACC and 2-0 under Riley. The Hokies are 7-4 in home season openers, and 25-6 in home openers. The Hokies kick off the 2008 campaign with their first ever meeting against Maryland-Eastern Shore.

August Starts- Tech will open the 2008 season in the month of August for the second straight year. The Hokies are 10-9 overall and 8-2 since 2001 in matches taking place in August.

Tournaments - Since 2006 the Hokies are 12-7 in regular season tournaments. Tech is 6-0 in the in its own Hokie Invite. The Hokies went 2-2 in last year's St. John's Volleyball Invitational. It was head coach Chris Riley's homecoming to where he coached at for six years as an assistant. Tech finished up the regular season by posting a 1-2 record at the Panther Invitational in Milwaukee, Wis. Tech went 6-3 in regular season tournaments in 2006.

Program Wins - Virginia Tech celebrated the program's 550th win on Oct. 20th of 2007. The victory came in a 3-1 decision against Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, N.C. The Hokies are now sitting on 552 wins.

Sophomore Encore -Felicia Willoughby shined in her freshman season, netting Tech single season records in total blocks (172) and block assists (143). The Pleasanton, Calif, native also ranked first on the team in hitting percentage (.274) and second on the squad in kills (303) in 2007. Willoughby's star numbers helped her win the ACC, AVCA East Region and VaSID Freshman of the Year honors. She was also named to the All-ACC Freshman team, and earned honorable mention all-region honors awarded by the American Volleyball Coaches Association. Now the only question is, what will she do for an encore?

Record-Setting Hokies - The Hokies continue to rise as a blocking power in the Atlantic Coast Conference. In 2007, with the help of some powerful middles, the Hokies set team season records in total bocks, with 394.5, and block assists, with 611, snapping the previous bests set in 2006.

Preseason Rankings - The ACC picked Virginia Tech to finish eighth in the conference. The Hokies tied for eighth last season with Miami and Boston College, with an 8-14 record in conference and a 14-18 posting overall.

Opponent Coaching Carousel - Four of Virginia Tech's opponents this year will be breaking in new coaches. Robert Puliza takes over Arkansas' coaching position, vacated by Chris Poole, who left for Florida State. Tim Hormsmon replaced long-time coach Janice Kruger at Maryland, and Lee Maes was tabbed for the coaching vacancy at Virginia.

First Meetings - The Hokies will have their first meetings ever with four opponents this year, including their first two adversaries of the season, Maryland-Eastern Shore and Winston-Salem State. Tech will also match up with Lamar and Arkansas for the first time in the program's history. Arkansas is one of only two SEC schools Tech has never played, the other is Vanderbilt.

Lady Hawks Series - This is the first meeting between the Hokies and the Lady Hawks.

Rams Series - This is the first meeting between the Hokies and the Rams.

Chanticleers Series - Tech is 2-1 overall against the Chanticleers, with the only loss coming in the teams' last meeting in 2002, 2-3. Coastal Carolina won the first two sets, but the Hokies battled back to capture the next two and force a fifth set. The Chanticleers thwarted the Hokies' comeback though, taking the deciding stanza 12-15. Tech's two previous wins came by way of sweeps in 1991 and 1989.

THE RILEY FILE

Chris Riley is entering his third season as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team.

Riley guided a young Tech squad to a 14-18 record overall last season, and a 8-14 mark in the ACC, tying for eighth place in the conference. Riley led the group to the program's 550th victory, coming over Wake Forest on Oct. 20th, and its second-consecutive sweep of the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational.

Under Riley, the Hokies earned Virginia Tech records with 611 block assists and 394.5 total blocks as a team in 2007. Freshman standout Felicia Willoughby flourished with Riley's direction, having one of the best seasons ever for a Hokie rookie. Willoughby set a Tech record with 172 total blocks on the season, ranking 1st in the ACC and 11th in the

nation. Willoughby also broke a Hokie record with 143 block assists.

In 2006, Riley led the team to its best finish since joining the ACC. The Hokies finished with a 17-14 overall record, their first winning season since 2002, and fourth in the past 14 years. Tech won a school-record 11 conference matches, including season sweeps of the 2005 Co-ACC Champions and NCAA Tournament participants, Maryland and UNC.

Prior to coming to Tech, Riley spent six seasons at Towson University, where he led the team to five straight 20-win seasons, three Colonial Athletic Association regular season championships, the 2004 CAA tournament championship and the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

WHAT IS A HOKIE, ANYWAY?

That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech".

Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

The all-event pass will premiere at a charter price of \$5.99 per month.
