The Hokies: Tech sits at 4-2 overall entering this weekend's tournament. The Hokies began the year with its third consecutive sweep as host of the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational. Tech dropped Maryland-Eastern Shore 3-1, Winston-Salem State 3-0 and Coastal Carolina 3-1 to take the tournament. Betsy Horowitz registered 24 kills and 12 blocks as tournament MVP. The Hokies posted a 1-2 record last week, losing back-to-back, five-set matches to Marshall and Western Kentucky, before sweeping East Tennessee State. Felicia Willoughby recorded 26 kills and 13 blocks in the three matches, and was named to the all-tournament team.

Scouting the Skyhawks: Heading into the weekend, Tennessee-Martin has played nine matches. The Skyhawks have won their first two decisions against Northwestern State and Texas A&M Corpus Christi, but lost their next seven, being swept four times. Senior Taylor Noland leads the team with 86 kills.

Scouting the Lady Cardinals: Lamar, like the Skyhawks, are riding a long losing streak. After winning their first match of the season against Prairie View A&M, the Lady Cardinals have dropped their last five. Lamar and Tech have a common opponent in Coastal Carolina. The Hokies defeated the Chanticleers 3-1 on Aug. 30, while the Lady Cardinals fell to CCU 3-2 at the Wichita State Tournament.

Scouting the Razorbacks: Coach Robert Pulliza picked up his first win as Arkansas' new head coach against Georgia State on Sept. 7. Previously, the Razorbacks had lost their first five matches to start out the season. Freshman Kelli Stipanovich has been a pleasant surprise for the Hogs, racking up a team-high 45 kills and 28 digs on the year.

Tournaments - Since 2006 the Hokies are 16-9 in regular season tournaments. Tech is 9-0 in its own Hokie Invite. The Hokies went 3-0 in the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational this year, with wins against Maryland-Eastern Shore (3-1), Winston-Salem State (3-0) and Coastal Carolina (3-1).

Triple-Double - Michelle Lang racked up 13 kills, 22 assists and 10 digs against Maryland-Eastern Shore for Virginia Tech's first triple-double in seven years. Cheryl Stinson tallied 11 kills, 19 digs and a school record 17 blocks against West Virginia on Oct. 5, 2001 for the Hokies' last triple-double.

Climbing the Charts - Michelle Lang currently sits in fifth place all time at Virginia Tech with 2,862 assists. The Valparaiso, Ind., native needs 228 more assists to climb into fourth ahead of Laura Hanner.

Program Wins - Virginia Tech celebrated the program's 550th win on Oct. 20th of 2007. The victory came in a 3-1 decision against Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, N.C. The Hokies are now sitting on 556 wins.

Sophomore Encore - Felicia Willoughby shined in her freshman season, netting Tech single season records in total blocks (172) and block assists (143). The Pleasanton, Calif., native also ranked first on the team in hitting percentage (.274) and second on the squad in kills (303) in 2007. Willoughby's star numbers helped her win the ACC, AVCA East Region and VaSID Freshman of the Year honors. She was also named to the All-ACC Freshman team, and earned honorable mention all-region honors awarded by the American Volleyball Coaches Association. Now the only question is, what will she do for an encore?

Record-Setting Hokies - The Hokies continue to rise as a blocking power in the Atlantic Coast Conference. In 2007, with the help of some powerful middles, the Hokies set team season records in total blocks with 394.5 and block assists with 611, snapping the previous bests set in 2006.

Preseason Rankings - The ACC picked Virginia Tech to finish eighth in the conference. The Hokies tied for eighth last season with Miami and Boston College, with an 8-14 record in conference and a 14-18 posting overall.

Opponent Coaching Carousel - Four of Virginia Tech's opponents this year will be breaking in new coaches. Robert Puliza takes over Arkansas' coaching position, vacated by Chris Poole, who left for Florida State. Tim Hormsmon replaced long-time coach Janice Kruger at Maryland, and Lee Maes was tabbed for the coaching vacancy at Virginia.

First Meetings - The Hokies will have their first meetings against two more opponents this weekend. Tech defeated its first two adversaries of the season, Maryland-Eastern Shore and Winston-Salem State, in its first-ever meeting with them. Tech will also match up with Lamar and Arkansas for the first time in the program's history. Arkansas is one of only two SEC schools Tech has never played, the other is Vanderbilt.

Skyhawk Series - The Hokies and Skyhawks have only met once, 1977, Tech's first season as a program. The Hokies won the matchup 2-1.

Lady Cardinals Series - Saturday will mark the first ever matchup between Tech and Lamar.

Razorback Series - Saturday night will mark the first ever time the Hokies and Razorbacks have played each other. Arkansas is one of two SEC teams Tech has never played. The other is Vanderbilt.

THE RILEY FILE

Chris Riley is in his third season as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team. Riley guided a young Tech squad to a 14-18 record overall last season, and a 8-14 mark in the ACC, tying for eighth place in the conference. Riley led the group to the program's 550th victory, coming over Wake Forest on Oct. 20th, and its second-consecutive sweep of the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational.

Under Riley, the Hokies earned Virginia Tech records with 611 block assists and 394.5 total blocks as a team in 2007. Freshman standout Felicia Willoughby flourished with Riley's direction, having one of the best seasons ever for a Hokie rookie. Willoughby set a Tech record with 172 total blocks on the season, ranking 1st in the ACC and 11th in the nation. Willoughby also broke a Hokie record with 143 block assists.

In 2006, Riley led the team to its best finish since joining the ACC. The Hokies finished with a 17-14 overall record, their first winning season since 2002, and fourth in the past 14 years. Tech won a school-record 11 conference matches, including season sweeps of the 2005 Co-ACC Champions and NCAA Tournament participants, Maryland and UNC.

Prior to coming to Tech, Riley spent six seasons at Towson University, where he led the team to five straight 20-win seasons, three Colonial Athletic Association regular season championships, the 2004 CAA tournament championship and the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

WHAT IS A HOKIE, ANYWAY?

That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech".

Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Fans can watch events live or on-demand on a per-event basis (\$3.99 per event) or with an all-event pass which will allow unlimited access to Virginia Tech events and will allow Hokie fans to check the competition throughout the ACC.

The all-event pass will premiere at a charter price of \$5.99 per month.
