**The Hokies:** Tech won its first ACC match of the season with a thrilling 3-2 victory over Miami in Coral Gables on Sunday. The win marked the Hokies first victory at Miami in school history. Two days earlier, Tech battled, but lost to 18th-ranked Florida State, 3-1. The Hokies are 11-3 on the season with a 1-2 record in league play, and are led by sophomore setter Erin Leaser, who ranks second in the ACC, averaging 10.75 assists per set.

**Scouting the Demon Deacons:** Wake Forest struggled early in 2009, opening the season with 10 consecutive losses, including a sweep at the hands of Duke in its first conference match of the year. Since then, the Demon Deacons have won four in a row with sweeps of Appalachian State and Liberty, as well as a 3-2 victory at Boston College and a 3-1 decision at Maryland. Wake Forest ranks in the bottom-three of all major statistical categories in the ACC, except for digs per set, where the 'Deacs are averaging 15.07 per set, good for third place in the league.

**Scouting the Blue Devils:** In the ACC preseason poll, the league's coaches picked Duke to finish first in the conference. Currently, the Blue Devils are tied for the top spot with Florida State and Georgia Tech, boasting a 3-0 record. Duke has not lost a set in conference action, sweeping Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, Maryland in College Park and Boston College in Chestnut Hill. The Blue Devils also own impressive victories at Wisconsin, at Georgia and at home against Colorado State, and are 13-2 overall. Duke holds a lethal combination, hitting at a .288 clip as team good enough second place in the ACC, while holding opponents to a .137 hitting percentage, ranking first in the league.

# 2009 SEASON SUPERLATIVES

**Big Road Win** - Virginia Tech defeated Miami, 3-2, in Coral Gables last Sunday, marking the Hokies' first victory at Miami in program history. Tech will get another opportunity to make history on Saturday, as the Hokies have never beaten Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium. They are 0-13 against the Blue Devils in Durham all-time.

**Assist-Machine** - Sophomore Erin Leaser is second in the ACC in assists so far this season, averaging 10.75 per set. The Allentown, Pa., native ranks 33rd in the nation in assists per set.

**Tech Defense** - Defensively, Tech has been one of the best teams, not only in the ACC, but in the country this year. The Hokies are averaging 2.49 blocks per set, good enough for third place in the conference and 38th in the nation. Tech's opponents are also only hitting .160 on the season, third-best in the ACC.

**Can You Dig It?** - Jill Gergen currently owns 1,432 digs in her career. The Topeka, Kan., native tallied 51 digs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational to move into fourth all-time among Hokies.

**Riley Milestone** - Head coach Chris Riley won his 200th career match as a Division I head coach in the sweep of Norfolk State on Sept. 5. Riley is 62-46 with the Hokies and went 144-54 in six seasons at the helm at Towson. His overall record stands at 206-100.

**Tournaments** - The Hokies finished 10-2 in regular season tournaments in 2009, winning the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational for the fourth straight year, the inaugural VT Tournament and the American Tournament. The Hokies went 1-2 at the Marriott Cavalier Invitational last weekend to round out the non-conference schedule. Since Riley took over the program in 2006, the Hokies are 15-0 against non-conference opponents in Cassell Coliseum, including a 6-0 mark this season.

**Preseason Rankings** - The Atlantic Coast Conference picked Virginia Tech to finish sixth in the conference with 71 points. Junior Felicia Willoughby was named preseason All-ACC for the second consecutive year.

**Topping the Charts** - In 2008, Felicia Willoughby broke the single-season school record and led the ACC in hitting percentage, striking at a .402 clip. Betsy Horowitz ranked third all-time with a hitting percentage of .351 last season. Willoughby currently ranks first in Tech's record books with a .334 career hitting percentage, while Horowitz stands in fifth, owning a career hitting percentage of .281.

**Setting the Table** - Last season, as a freshman, Erin Leaser recorded 1,084 assists, the fifth-most in a single season for a freshman in Tech history. Making the numbers even more impressive, Leaser did not become the team's lone setter until the fifth match of the season. Senior Michelle Lang has also been a mainstay for Tech in setting. The Valparaiso, Ind., native ranks fifth all-time in school history with 2,923 career assists.

**More on Leaser** - Along with breaking into Tech's freshmen record book, Erin Leaser also ranked 14th in the country among freshmen averaging 9.77 assists per set in 2008.

**Academic Values** - The Tech volleyball squad has a rich tradition of academic excellence. Kristen Cunningham, Jill Gergen and Erin Leaser have all earned academic all-conference honors. Alison Blasingame, Kirsty Blue, Kristen Cunningham, Gemma Donovan, Jill Gergen, Erin Leaser, Taylor Parrish, Amy Wengrenovich and Jennifer Wiker were all named to the ACC Honor Roll as well.

**Newcomers** - Tech welcomes four freshmen to the squad this season. Cara Baarendse and Liz Trinchere will add depth at middle blocker. Baarendse was Conference Player of the Year in 2008 at Mason High in Mason, Ohio, while Trinchere was all-state her junior and senior seasons at Glenvar High in Salem, Va. Morgan O'Neill, who will play outside hitter for the Hokies, hails from Atherton, Calif., where she played at Archbishop Mitty and earned second-team Under Armour All-America honors as a senior. Jessica Wellman comes to the Hokies from McKinney North High School in McKinney, Texas. Wellman is a two-time all-district defensive specialist.

owns a 22-8 series lead over Wake Forest, including a 12-7 mark away from Cassell Coliseum. Tech head coach Chris Riley is 4-2 against the Demon Deacons in his time with the Hokies. The two squads split last year, with each winning at home.

### Blue Devil Series - The Hokies are 1-18

all-time against Duke in their history, and have lost seven matches in a row to the Blue Devils. Most recently, Tech went toe-to-toe with 2008 NCAA Tournament participant Duke, dropping a heartbreaker in the fifth set, 22-20.

## THE RILEY FILE

Chris Riley is in his fourth season as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team.

In 2008, Riley took a young squad, welcoming seven newcomers, and turned it into a strong ACC contender. The Hokies went 20-11, 11-9 in the league, winning 20 matches for the first time since 2002, and sat atop the ACC standings for much of the conference season. Tech also won 11 straight matches at one point in the season, matching the longest winning streak in school history.

Riley guided a young Tech squad to a 14-18 record overall in 2007, and an 8-14 mark in the ACC, tying for eighth place in the conference. Riley led the group to the program's 550th victory, coming over Wake Forest on Oct. 20th.

Under Riley, the Hokies earned Virginia Tech records with 611 block assists and 394.5 total blocks as a team in 2007. Freshman standout Felicia Willoughby flourished under Riley's direction, having one of the best seasons ever for a Hokie rookie. Willoughby set a Tech record with 172 total blocks on the season, ranking first in the ACC and 11th in the nation.

In 2006, Riley led the team to its best finish since joining the ACC. The Hokies finished with a 17-14 overall record, their first winning season since 2002, and fourth in the past 14 years.

Prior to coming to Tech, Riley spent six seasons at Towson University, where he led the team to five straight 20-win seasons, three Colonial Athletic Association regular season championships, the 2004 CAA tournament championship and the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

## WHAT IS A HOKIE, ANYWAY?

That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.

## JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech".

Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.
