The Hokies: The Hokies enter their final road trip of the season having lost five of their last seven, but defeated Wake Forest, 3-1, in their last time out. Junior Felicia Willoughby and sophomore Justine Record lead the way offensively for the Hokies. Willoughby ranks first on the team in kills and blocks, with 300 and 132, respectively, while Record has racked up 297 kills on the year and has led the squad in 15 of 17 matches. Sophomore Erin Leaser is second in the ACC as assists per set, averaging 11.20 per frame, and leads the ACC with 1,210 assists.

Scouting the Tigers: Defensively, Clemson is one of the best teams in the ACC this season. The Tigers top the league in blocks per set, averaging 2.78 per period, and rank second in the conference in opponent hitting percentage, holding their opponents to a .165 clip. Alexa Rand and Sandra Adeleye have combined for 237 blocks on the year, and libero Didem Ege is second in the ACC with 4.93 assists per set. The Tigers have won six of their last seven, but are only 2-2 in their last four home matches.

Scouting the Yellow Jackets: After being picked to finish eighth in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Georgia Tech has surprised teams this season. The Yellow Jackets boast an 18-9 record overall and a 12-5 mark in the league. Setter Mary Ashley Tippins leads the ACC in assists per set. Tippins holds an 11.35 assists per set average, and has helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in the category as a team with 12.87 assists per set, and rank second in the league in kills per set, averaging 13.79 per stanza.

Tiger Series - The Hokies have had success against the traditionally strong Clemson program since joining the ACC. Tech is 6-5 overall against the Tigers since 2004 and 7-9 against them all-time. Tech downed Clemson in a thrilling, come-from-behind victory, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum, earlier this season.

Yellow Jacket Series - Georgia Tech leads the all-time series between the two squads, 7-5, but the Hokies won the last meeting, 3-0, on Oct. 16 in Cassell Coliseum. The Hokies are 2-4 against the Yellow Jackets in Atlanta.

THE RILEY FILE

Chris Riley is in his fourth season as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team. In 2008, Riley took a young squad, welcoming seven newcomers, and turned it into a strong ACC contender. The Hokies went 20-11, 11-9 in the league, winning 20 matches for the first time since 2002, and sat atop the ACC standings for much of the conference season. Tech also won 11 straight matches at one point in the season, matching the longest winning streak in school history.

Riley guided a young Tech squad to a 14-18 record overall in 2007, and an 8-14 mark in the ACC, tying for eighth place in the conference. Riley led the group to the program's 550th victory, coming over Wake Forest on Oct. 20th.

Under Riley, the Hokies earned Virginia Tech records with 611 block assists and 394.5 total blocks as a team in 2007. Freshman standout Felicia Willoughby flourished under Riley's direction, having one of the best seasons ever for a Hokie rookie. Willoughby set a Tech record with 172 total blocks on the season, ranking first in the ACC and 11th in the nation.

In 2006, Riley led the team to its best finish since joining the ACC. The Hokies finished with a 17-14 overall record, their first winning season since 2002, and fourth in the past 14 years.

Prior to coming to Tech, Riley spent six seasons at Towson University, where he led the team to five straight 20-win seasons, three Colonial Athletic Association regular season championships, the 2004 CAA Tournament championship and the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

WHAT IS A HOKIE, ANYWAY?

That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech".

Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

2009 SEASON SUPERLATIVES

Home Sweet Home - The Hokies are playing well in Cassell Coliseum on the year with an impressive 11-3 record, including a 5-3 mark against ACC opponents. Tech lost its first two matches of the season in Blacksburg against Miami and Florida State on Oct. 30th and 31st, respectively. Prior to the two losses, Tech won 10 straight matches at home this year, and 12 in a row going back to 2008.

Avoiding the Broom - The Hokies have only been swept once all season, and are 8-1 in three-set matches this year. The Hokies have not been swept in 28 of their last 29 matches. Also, of the squad's nine losses, only three have come in five-set matches. Tech is 5-3 in five-set contests and 5-6 in four-set affairs.

Freshman Best, Baar None - Freshman Cara Baarendse is vaulting up the freshman record list. She currently holds the highest season hitting percentage for a Tech freshman, hovering at .340 for the year. The Mason, Ohio, native also sits in ninth place in kills in the Hokie freshman record books with 250.

Willoughby on the Block - Junior Felicia Willoughby racked up 13 blocks in a 3-2 loss against North Carolina on Nov. 8. The 13 blocks ties for second most by a Hokie in a single match in school history. The last time a Hokie recorded 13 blocks or more was when Cheryl Stinson stuffed a school-record 17 attacks against West Virginia on Nov. 8, 1997. Her 12 block assists in the match also ranks second in the Tech record books.

The Willoughby Wall - Willoughby now ranks fourth all-time in career blocks, with 421. She is 31 blocks shy of third place Cheryl Stinson. The Pleasanton, Calif., product also owns 346 block assists in her career, which ranks fourth in Tech history as well.

For the Record - Sophomore Justine Record landed a career-high 26 kills in the win over Clemson on Oct. 17. The 26 kills is the most by a Hokie in a match since Annie Spicer drilled 26 kills against Virginia on Nov. 18, 2004. Record followed that up with a 23-kill performance against BC on Oct. 23. The Redwood City, Calif., native has led Tech in kills in 12 of the last 13 matches.

Gergen into Third Place - Gergen currently owns 1,663 digs in her career. The Topeka, Kan., native tallied 15 digs against Florida State on Oct. 31 to move into third place all-time in the Hokie

record books, passing Lisa Pikalek. She moved into fourth place earlier in the year after registering 51 digs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational.

More on Gergen - In the thrilling 3-2 comeback win over Clemson on Oct. 17, senior Jill Gergen tallied 37 digs, setting a Tech record for most individual digs in a match by an individual. Gergen surpassed the former record of 35, set by Amanda Cloyd on Nov. 6, 2004. Gergen totaled 31 digs earlier in the year against Villanova, marking the first time a Hokie earned over 30 digs in a match since Cloyd recorded 33 on Oct. 26, 2006.

Athletes of the Week - For her efforts against Georgia Tech and Clemson on Oct. 16 and 17, respectively, the ACC named Justine Record Player of the Week. It was the first time this season a Hokie received the accolade. Three Hokies have been named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week this season. Jill Gergen received Tech Athlete of the Week honors on Oct. 19, after recording a school-record 37 digs against Clemson. Senior Taylor Parrish and junior Felicia Willoughby also garnered Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week accolades earlier this year.

The Comeback Kids - Tech has taken a never-give-up attitude into its matches this season and it has paid off. The Hokies came back from deficits of 11-2 and 18-11 to defeat Georgia Tech in the second set of the Hokies' sweep of the Yellow Jackets on Oct. 17. The next day, Tech found themselves behind 21-14 and down two sets in the third frame against Clemson. The Hokies battled all the way back to win the third period, 26-24, and then captured the next two sets to win the match, 3-2.

Opening ACC Road Trip - The ACC schedule started out roughly for the Hokies, who faced a brutal slate to start out the league's contests. Tech played its first five conference matches on the road, while no other ACC school had to play more than two away matches to start the conference season. The Hokies went 1-4 on the trip and won their first-ever victory over Miami in Coral Gables.

Assist Machine - Sophomore Erin Leaser is second in the ACC in assists so far this season, averaging 11.20 per set. The Allentown, Pa., native ranks 22nd in the nation in assists per set. She tallied a career-high 65 assists against Boston College on Oct. 23.

Tech Defense - Defensively, Tech has been one of the best teams in the ACC this year. Tech is holding its opponents to a .178 hitting percentage this year and is averaging 2.29 blocks per set, ranking fourth and third, respectively, in the ACC. Felicia Willoughby is third in the conference, averaging 1.22 blocks per set.

Riley Milestone - Head coach Chris Riley won his 200th career match as a Division I head coach in the sweep of Norfolk State on Sept. 5. Riley is 69-53 with the Hokies and went 144-54 in six seasons at the helm at Towson. His overall record stands at 213-107.

Tournaments - The Hokies finished 10-2 in regular season tournaments in 2009, winning the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational for the fourth straight year, the inaugural VT Tournament and the American Tournament. The Hokies went 1-2 at the Marriott Cavalier Invitational last weekend to round out the non-conference schedule. Since Riley took over the program in 2006, the Hokies are 15-0 against non-conference opponents in Cassell Coliseum, including a 6-0 mark this season.

Preseason Rankings - The ACC picked Virginia Tech to finish sixth in the conference with 71 points. Junior Felicia Willoughby was named preseason All-ACC for the second consecutive year.

Topping the Charts - In 2008, Felicia Willoughby broke the single-season school record and led the ACC in hitting percentage, striking at a .402 clip. Betsy Horowitz ranked third all-time with a hitting percentage of .351 last season. Willoughby currently ranks first in Tech's record books with a .334 career hitting percentage, while Horowitz stands in fifth, owning a career hitting percentage of .281.

Setting the Table - Last season, as a freshman, Erin Leaser recorded 1,084 assists, the fifth-most in a single season for a freshman in Tech history. Making the numbers even more impressive, Leaser did not become the team's lone setter until the fifth match of the season. Senior Michelle Lang has also been a mainstay for Tech in setting. The Valparaiso, Ind., native ranks fifth all-time in school history with 2,926 career assists.

More on Leaser - Along with breaking into Tech's freshmen record book, Erin Leaser also ranked 14th in the country among freshmen averaging 9.77 assists per set in 2008.

Academic Values - The Tech volleyball squad has a rich tradition of academic excellence. Kristen Cunningham, Jill Gergen and Erin Leaser all earned academic all-conference honors in 2008. Alison Blasingame, Kirsty Blue, Kristen Cunningham, Gemma Donovan, Jill Gergen, Erin Leaser, Taylor Parrish, Amy Wengrenovich and Jennifer Wiker were all named to the ACC Honor Roll as well.

Newcomers - Tech welcomes four freshmen to the squad this season. Cara Baarendse and Liz Trinchere will add depth at middle blocker. Baarendse was Conference Player of the Year in 2008 at Mason High in Mason, Ohio, while Trinchere was all-state her junior and senior seasons at Glenvar High in Salem, Va. Morgan O'Neill, who will play outside hitter for the Hokies, hails from Atherton, Calif., where she played at Archbishop Mitty and earned second-team Under Armour All-America honors as a senior. Jessica Wellman comes to the Hokies from McKinney North High School in McKinney, Texas. Wellman is a two-time all-district defensive specialist.
