Hokies vs. Musketeers: The all-time series between the Musketeers and the Hokies is tied at five apiece. The two teams played each other 10 times from 1995-99 when they were both A-10 members, but have not faced since.

Hokies vs. Lady Vols: The Lady Vols have had tremendous success against the Hokies over the years, going 13-1 all-time. The Hokies' only victory in the series came on Nov. 7, 1995, by a score of 3-1.

TECH'S 2009 RECORD WHEN...

Home Sweet Home - The Hokies played extremely well in Cassell Coliseum last season with an impressive 12-3 record, including a 6-3 mark against ACC opponents. Tech's first two losses in Blacksburg came against Miami and Florida State on Oct. 30 and 31, respectively. Prior to the two losses, Tech had won its first 10 home matches, running the win streak to 12 dating back to 2008.

Preseason Rankings - The Atlantic Coast Conference picked Virginia Tech to finish eighth in the conference with 55 points. Senior Felicia Willoughby was named preseason All-ACC for the third consecutive year.

Avoiding the Broom - The Hokies were only swept twice all season in 2009, and were 8-2 in three-set matches on the year. The Hokies have not been swept in 34 of their last 36 matches. Also, of the squad's 12 losses, only three came in

Since Tech changed the name of its home tournament to the Hokie Invitational in 2006, Tech has gone 12-0, capturing all four tournament titles. The Hokies look to claim their fifth straight title in the 2010 Hokie Invitational, which will be held next weekend, Sept. 3-4, in Cassell Coliseum.

The Hokies have had great tournament success the past two seasons with a combined 19-4 tournament record in 2008 and 2009, sweeping six of their last eight tournaments.

five-set matches. Tech was 5-3 in five-set contests and 6-7 in four-set affairs.

Freshman Best, Baar None - Sophomore Cara Baarendse vaulted up the freshman record books last season, breaking the freshman school record for season hitting percentage. Baarendse struck at a .354 clip, surpassing the old mark of .333 set by Katie Esbrook in 2003. She also ranks third all-time among all Hokies with the .354 hitting percentage.

Willoughby on the Block - Senior Felicia Willoughby racked up 13 blocks in a 3-2 loss against North Carolina on Nov. 8, 2009. The 13 blocks ties for second most by a Hokie in a single match in school history. The last time a Hokie recorded 13 blocks or more was when Cheryl Stinson stuffed a school-record 17 attacks against West Virginia on Nov. 8, 1997. Her 12 block assists in the match also ranks third in the Tech record books.

The Willoughby Wall - Willoughby now ranks fourth all-time in career blocks, with 428. She is 24 blocks shy of third-place Cheryl Stinson. The Pleasanton, Calif., product also owns 352 block assists in her career, which ranks fourth in Tech history as well. Willoughby, who averages 142.7 blocks per season, is just 66 blocks away from becoming Tech's all-time blocking leader, and needs just 22 block assists to lead that category as well.

For the Record - Junior Justine Record landed a career-high 26 kills in the win over Clemson on Oct. 17, 2009. The 26 kills is the most by a Hokie in a match since Annie Spicer drilled 26 kills against Virginia on Nov. 18, 2004. Record followed that up with a 23-kill performance against Boston College on Oct. 23.

Athletes of the Week - For her efforts against Georgia Tech and Clemson on Oct. 16 and 17, 2009, the ACC named Justine Record Player of the Week. It was the only time all season that a Hokie received the accolade. Felicia Willoughby garnered Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week earlier in the season on Sept. 7.

The Comeback Kids - Tech took a never-give-up attitude into its matches last season and it paid off. The Hokies came back from deficits of 11-2 and 18-11 to defeat Georgia Tech in the second set of the Hokies' sweep of the Yellow Jackets on Oct. 17. The next day, Tech found themselves down two sets to none and behind 21-14 in the third frame against Clemson. The Hokies battled all the way back to win the third, 26-24, and then captured the next two sets to win the match, 3-2.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Following the Hokies - Fans and media can keep up with the Hokies via the Internet with live stats. At all home matches and select away matches, play-by-play, up-to-date box scores and stats can be accessed by clicking the live stats link on Tech's home page: <http://www.hokiesports.com/volleyball/live>. Fans will also be able to listen to select home contests thanks to Hokies All-Access. VT fans can access Hokies All-Access through the link on hokiesports.com. Jerry Massey will broadcast the volleyball matches. Single Game Pay-Per-View Licenses for \$7.95 will give you access to live audio on a single event basis; Monthly Subscriptions will be \$9.95 and will give you access to all live and archived radio broadcasts, video highlights and any other content behind the subscription wall; Annual Subscriptions will be sold for \$79.95 and will give you access to all live and archived radio broadcasts, video highlights and live video of the Virginia Tech Hokies in action.

What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.

HEAD COACH CHRIS RILEY

Chris Riley is in his fifth season as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team.

Last season, Riley led the Hokies to a 12-3 record in Cassell Coliseum, picking up the most home wins since 1998. It was just the sixth time in Hokie history that the team won 12 or more at matches home. Tech finished with a 19-12 overall record, going 9-11 in ACC play and finishing in a tie with Wake Forest for seventh.

In 2008, Riley took a young squad, welcoming seven newcomers, and turned it into a strong ACC contender. The Hokies went 20-11, 11-9 in the league, winning 20 matches for the first time since 2002, and sat atop the ACC standings for much of the conference season. Tech also won 11 straight matches at one point in the season, matching the longest winning streak in school history.

Riley guided a young Tech squad to a 14-18 overall record in 2007 and an 8-14 mark in the ACC, tying for eighth place in the conference. Riley led the group to the

program's 550th victory, coming over Wake Forest on Oct. 20th.

Under Riley, the Hokies earned Virginia Tech records with 611 block assists and 394.5 total blocks as a team in 2007. Freshman standout Felicia Willoughby flourished under Riley's direction, having one of the best seasons ever for a Hokie rookie. Willoughby set a Tech record with 172 total blocks on the season, ranking first in the ACC and 11th in the nation.

In 2006, Riley led the team to its best finish since joining the ACC. The Hokies finished with a 17-14 overall record, their first winning season since 2002, and fourth in the past 14 years.

Prior to coming to Tech, Riley spent six seasons at Towson University, where he led the team to five straight 20-win seasons, three Colonial Athletic Association regular season championships, the 2004 CAA tournament championship and the 2004 NCAA Tournament.
