The No. 16 Hokies will break from conference play for a mid-week match up with Longwood on Wednesday and later play host to No. 8 Boston College in a Sunday afternoon game. Tech recently snapped a seven-game winning streak with a loss to No. 13 Maryland but will look to get back to their winning ways as they return home, where they are 6-0, for a week of play.

Scouting Report: Longwood

Longwood enters Wednesday's game with an 8-5-0 record, recently snapping a five-game winning streak with two losses. Michelle DeSieno leads the team with six goals while Lindsey Ottavio has a team-leading six assists on the season.

Kyra Byron and Marcia Biddle have split time in net for the Lancers with Byron seeing more time and making more starts. Byron enters the match with a 5-2-0 record, one shutout and has made 27 saves on the year, while Biddle sits at 3-3-0 on the season with 31 saves and a shutout.

Scouting Report: Boston College

Boston College enters the match with an 11-2-0 record, 3-2-0 in the ACC, but will play at Maryland on Thursday before arriving in Blacksburg. Leading the Eagles in scoring this season is Victoria DiMartino with 11 goals. Hannah Cerrone leads the team with seven assists, while Gina DiMartino has been an important player for the Eagles, balancing six goals and six assists on the season.

Jillian Mastroianni has manned the net for the Eagles this season, boasting an 11-2-0 record, having made 30 saves so far, allowing just seven goals and tallying eight shutouts.

Last Time Out

The Hokies had a long week off with just one match against then-No. 19 Maryland after their triumphant week of play during the previous week. Tech snapped a seven-game winning streak as they fell to Maryland 1-3 on Sunday. Jennifer Harvey scored the only Hokie goal as she netted her third penalty kick of the season after a Terrapin foul in the box. Sophomore keeper Kristin Carden faced 10 shots on goal and stopped seven of them.

Looking Ahead

Tech will return to a full slate of ACC play from here on out as they prepare for a week of road games at Wake Forest on Thursday night and Duke on Sunday afternoon next week.

Series Info: Longwood

The Hokies are 3-0-0 all-time against the Longwood Lancers. Most recently, Tech outed the Lancers 2-0 at home in 2008 and beat them 4-0 on the road the year before that. The first meeting between the two teams was in 2004, the Hokies won the match 2-0.

Home or away, the Hokies have never let up a goal against Longwood and have never scored less than two goals against them.

Series Info: Boston College

Tech holds a 1-4-2 record against the Boston College Eagles, earning their first and only win against the conference opponent at home, on senior day, in 2007. The Hokies fell to the Eagles in their most recent matchup, the then-No. 13 squad won 2-1.

Boston College, who joined the ACC one year after the Hokies in 2005, was also Tech's conference foe from each team's days in the BIG EAST. The Hokies were never able to defeat the Eagles while in the BIG EAST as they tallied an 0-3 record during that three-year stint, but boast a 1-1-2 record against Boston College in ACC play.

HOKIES

Unchartered Territory

- The Hokies just ended a seven-game winning streak, their longest in program history, and are tied for the top spot in the ACC with No. 2 North Carolina as both teams boast a 4-1 record in conference.
- Tech ranks 16th in the nation this week, and saw its highest all-time ranking last week as they held the No. 12 ranking in the nation.

Facing Ranked Opponents

- Tech is in the midst of its ACC schedule, which, as of this week, has Tech facing two more ranked opponents.
- The Hokies have beaten 13 nationally ranked opponents since 1993.
- Under head coach Kelly Cagle, the Hokies have beaten 11 top-25 teams.
- So far this season, the Hokies have taken down No. 18 Virginia and No. 1 North Carolina
- In 2008, the Hokies earned three of those wins during the regular season, while they also advanced past then-No. 5 Florida State and then-No. 12 Virginia en route to the ACC Tournament championship game.

Tech In The Polls

- After defeating North Carolina, Tech was ranked for the first time since the NCAA Tournament last season when they were No. 25.
- The Hokies were ranked No. 12 in the nation after the big win, which is the highest the team has been ranked in program history.

Cagle And Program Firsts

- 2009 has been a year of firsts for Tech's women's soccer program as well as head coach Kelly Cagle. The team has tallied numerous history-making accomplishments so far.
- The Hokies' defeat of Davidson and Clemson were both firsts for Cagle, while the Clemson win was also a program first that broke a four-year streak of overtimes and ties.
- Tech's recent defeat of then-No. 18 Virginia in Charlottesville was the program's first victory over its rival on the road.
- The highlight of the Hokies' season so far has been the defeat of previously top-ranked North Carolina, the first defeat of the Tar Heels and a No. 1 team in program history. The loss was Carolina's first in 34 games and their first in conference in two years.

Season Firsts In ACC Play

- Since ACC play began for the Hokies, on Sept. 24 against Clemson, the team has accomplished many firsts of the season.
- Julian Johnson tallied her first multi-point game of the season, scoring the game-winner against Clemson and assisting the first goal of the game, earning the Hokies their first defeat of the Tigers in program history.
- Against NC State, Brittany Popko scored her first career goal while Sloane Levin and Stephanie Hylton tallied their first assists of the season, and Levin's career first. Sophomore goalkeeper Kristin Carden earned her first shutout of 2009 against the Wolfpack as well.
- The Hokies defeated then-No. 18 Virginia, claiming their first-ever victory in Charlottesville and their first victory over a ranked team this season.

Second Helpings

- Kristin Carden tallied her second shutout of the season at home against UNC.
- The Hokies recently earned their second victory over in-state rival Virginia.
- Marika Gray scored against North Carolina for the second time in her career, as she remains the only current Hokie to score on the Tar Heels.

- Julian Johnson scored her second game-winner of the season against Virginia.
- The Hokies earned their second victory of the year over a ranked team with their defeat of North Carolina.

Home Sweet Home

- The Hokies are a never-before-seen 6-0 at home so far this season.
- Tech has earned four of its six shutouts at home and scored 15 of its 26 goals when playing at Thompson Field.

Saving The Day

- Since her first start of the season against Davidson, sophomore keeper Kristin Carden has been a wall in front of the net for the Hokies, boasting the best week of her career when she shut out North Carolina and let up one goal against Virginia, making 15 total saves on the week.
- Carden currently holds a 5-1-0 record, 4-1-0 in ACC play, with 32 saves on the season and two shutouts.
- Carden earned five honors after her outstanding week of play including ACC Women's Soccer Player of the Week and NSCAA National Player of the Week, becoming the second Hokie to earn both in the same week (Ashley Kinser, Nov. 5, 2007). These are the first of such awards for Carden.

Julian Being Julian

- Senior Julian Johnson leads the team in assists so far this season with five, while she also has two scores on the season.
- The Norfolk, Va., native has tallied two game-winners on the season, in Tech's first defeat of Clemson and at Virginia.
- Johnson scored in the first half of Tech's 3-2 win over Davidson, off one of her signature throw-ins. Johnson threw the ball in, it hit the ground inside the goalie's box and bounced through her teammates and defenders into the goal.
- Johnson has also tallied five assists this season, connecting with classmate Emily Jukich for her first assist, later helping on three of junior Jennifer Harvey's five goals so far this season and

Junior Jennifer Harvey was the lone goal scorer for the Hokies against Maryland as she improved to 3-for-3 on the season in penalty kicks. Harvey tallied a hat trick earlier in the season and two of those three goals were penalty kicks.

The Roanoke, Va., native entered the season with three career goals and has already doubled that this season.

Harvey has been a pivotal part of the Hokie midfield, this season, helping keep the ball up the field and also assisting the strong Hokie back line that has helped tally six shutouts so far this season.

- Johnson has also tallied five assists this season, connecting with classmate Emily Jukich for her first assist, later helping on three of junior Jennifer Harvey's five goals so far this season and most recently assisting the game-winner against North Carolina.

Hats off for Harvey

- Junior Jennifer Harvey made Hokie history during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, scoring her first-career hat trick and becoming the 10th Hokie to ever score three goals in a game, the first since senior Emily Jukich did so in 2006.

- Harvey scored her first goal of the season in the 4-0 victory over UNC Greensboro was later the lone goal scorer for Tech in its 3-0 defeat of College of Charleston, adding her fifth score of the season against Clemson.

- Harvey recently improved to 3-3 on the season in penalty kicks as she scored Tech's only goal of the game against Maryland.

- For her history-making performance, Harvey not only earned Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week honors but became just the fourth Hokie to be named ACC Player of the Week as well. These are the first of such honors for Harvey.

Freshmen Unite

- So far this season, the new class of freshmen has tallied 20 points through 13 games. Freshman Kelly Conheaney leads the class, having scored six goals and assisted two this season, and she is tied for seventh in the ACC in goals scored. Two of her five goals were assisted by fellow freshmen, while two more have been unassisted.

- Conheaney netted her first-career score in the team's season opener at home against High Point. It was the first goal of the game and the first-career assist for midfielder Kelsey Mitchell. Conheaney's second goal of the season came against VCU as she headed the ball in off a free kick by freshman Julia Goldsworthy, her first-career assist as well. Goldsworthy recently added an assist against then-No. 18 Virginia.

- Sloane Levin is the only point-earning freshman that has yet to connect with another member of her class, as she scored her first-career goal against Villanova and earned her first assist at NC State.

Can't Catch Conheaney

- Kelly Conheaney has been red-hot since her first game as a Hokie, tallying six goals, two assists, 14 points and two multi-point games so far this season, while she also scored in five of the team's 13 games and tallied at least two points in five games as well.

- Conheaney scored Tech's first goal of the season against High Point and later recorded two assists and a goal against UNC Greensboro for her first multi-point game, most recently notching her second multi-point game with two goals against Davidson also scoring at NC State

- Conheaney has done her best work at home, where the Hokies are 5-0, as she has earned all but two of her points this season when playing on Thompson Field.

- Conheaney has put up the best numbers by a freshman in two years. She is tied with Jennifer Harvey for most goals scored so far this season with six, the exact mark Marika Gray was at eight games into her freshman season.

Helping Out The Team

- Robin Chidester recorded her first two assists of the season at the Villanova Classic before being called upon to play keeper for the Hokies and saw significant time in front of the net at the Spartan Classic in Greensboro, N.C. Chidester tallied two more starts in net as she started both games of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational.

- Chidester recorded her first two shutouts of the season at the Invitational, making it three for her career, as she shut down UNC Greensboro and the College of Charleston. Chidester has tallied 19 saves on the season and boasts a 3-1-0 record on the season.

- This season's action has been the senior leader's first time in net since playing two games as keeper in her sophomore season.

- Chidester recently scored her first goal of the season as the first goal of the game against then-No. 18 Virginia, helping the Hokies to just their second-ever defeat of their rival.

Back Again

- Forward Marika Gray has returned for the 2009 season after a knee injury forced her to sit out the majority of the season.

- Gray earned her first assist of the season against NC State and has scored five goals so far, including two against UNC Greensboro. This was the first multi-point game for Gray since Tech's 2-1 overtime win at Maryland on Oct. 28, 2006, when Gray assisted both Tech goals, as well as her first multi-goal game since she netted both Hokie goals in a 2-1 victory over then-No. 13 Tennessee in the same year.

- Gray's fifth score of the season was the only goal of the game as the Hokies defeated then-No. 1 North Carolina for the first time in program history. Gray also remains as the only current Hokie to have scored a goal on the Tar Heels. She also scored on them in 2007.

- Though Gray only competed in eight games in 2008, she still managed to finish the season third on the team in goals with four, assisting on one, and matched her career high of two game-winners. Gray scored in four of the eight games she played in and scored the only Hokie goal against then-No. 11 Texas A&M.

- The Alexandria, Va., native was the first Hokie to ever earn All-ACC honors at Tech and is tied for sixth in school history in single-season goals (8) and assists (6) after playing just a season and a half for the Hokies.

Tournament History

- The Hokies added to their already-successful regular season tournament record as host of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Tech wrapped up the tournament with a 2-0 record, bringing them to 14-8-1 under head coach Kelly Cagle, and 18-12-2 all-time.

- The Hokies boast a 5-2-1 record when hosting regular season tournaments. In last season's Hokie Invitational, Tech went 1-1 with a win over Charlotte, 5-3, and a loss to then-No. 11 Texas A&M, 1-3, while this season they finished the weekend with a 2-0 record, not allowing a goal, as they topped UNC Greensboro 4-0 and College of Charleston 3-0.

Opening Day Records

- The Hokies improved to 8-6-2 all-time on opening day with a win over High Point in their season opener. The Hokies also improved to 4-2-1 in openers under Coach Cagle, including a 2-1-1 mark at home.

Preseason Poll

- The coaches from around the ACC unanimously picked the defending national champions, North Carolina, to win their fifth-straight ACC title in the conference's preseason poll. Tech, who received votes in the SoccerBuzz preseason poll as well, was slated to finish seventh in the conference, which is where they finished the 2008 season.

- Rounding out the top five in the poll were Florida State in second, Boston College in third and Virginia and Duke ranked fourth and fifth, respectively. Each of the teams in the top-five of the ACC also rank in the top-25 in each of the major soccer polls.

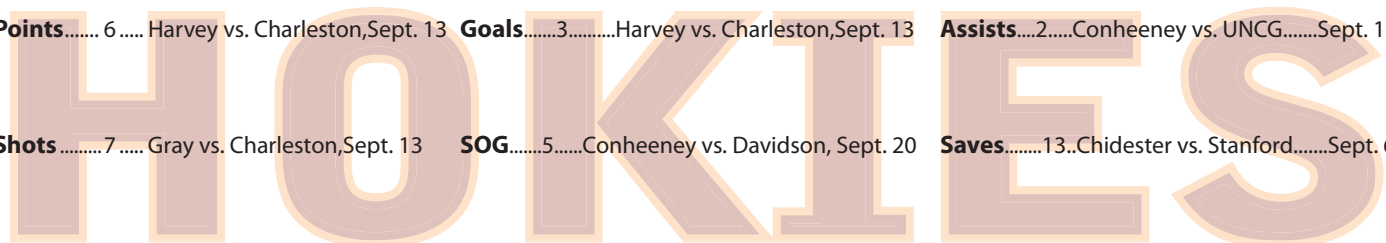
