

2008 Virginia Tech Women's Soccer

Game #15: Longwood at Virginia Tech - Thompson Field
Wednesday, Oct. 15, 2008 - 7 p.m.

GENERAL INFO

- The Virginia Tech women's soccer team hosts Longwood on Wednesday, Oct. 15 at 7 p.m. in the team's last non-conference match of the season.
- On Thursday, Oct. 9, the Hokies secured the largest upset in program history, defeating No. 8 Virginia 1-0. Junior **Julian Johnson** scored the game-winner early in the second half and the Tech defense shut down the UVa offense the rest of the way.
- Looking to use the momentum garnered from their upset of Virginia, the Hokies traveled to Chapel Hill on Sunday, Oct. 12 to take on the No. 2 Tar Heels of North Carolina. The potent UNC offense proved to be quite a challenge as the Heels went on to win 4-0.

MORE ON THE VIRGINIA MATCH

- For the first time in program history, the Hokies were able to knock off in-state and ACC rival Virginia. Prior to Thursday's 1-0 victory, Tech was 0-8 all-time against UVa, and the Cavaliers had outscored the Hokies 31-2.
- No. 8 Virginia was also the highest ranked team the Hokies had ever defeated. Last season, Tech surprised No. 10 Boston College on Senior Day for the program's first victory against a top 10 opponent.
- Junior **Julian Johnson** netted the game-winner, her third goal of the season and second in the last three contests.
- Freshman **Kristin Carden** picked up her third shutout of the season, moving her into a tie for seventh place in the record book for career shutouts.

END OF THE LINE

- The Hokies' 4-0 loss on Sunday to No. 2 North Carolina marked the first time all season Tech had been shutout in a match. The Hokies had scored at least one goal in all of their previous 13 matches, setting a new program single-season record.

RIGHT AT HOME

- Newly-christened Sandra D. Thompson Field has proved to be a difficult place for opponents to play as the Hokies are 5-2 on their home field. Tech's only losses at home came against No. 6 Texas A&M, 3-1, and against James Madison in a double overtime thriller, 4-3.
- The Hokies have yet to register a win in 2008 while away from home.
- Tech has scored 16 goals at Thompson Field and allowed only nine scores. On the road, however, the Hokies have netted six goals and allowed their opponents 15.

SECOND HALF RALLY

- The Hokies have become very adept at putting together scoring rallies during the second half. Twenty-two of Tech's 29 goals this season have come in the second half.
- Tech has taken 42 more shots during the second frame, 121-83, compared to the opening half.
- Hokie opponents are also taking more shots in the second frame, 91-79, but opposing teams have only scored one more goal after halftime, 11-10, than in the first period.

TECH RECORDS WATCH

- Senior **Laurie Beth Puglisi** sits in second place in career points with 53. She only needs eight more points this season to tie Emily Barnhart's record 61 points. Puglisi has also moved up in the career goals category. Currently in the second spot in career goals, she needs four to surpass Barnhart, who leads with 24.
- Junior **Julian Johnson** picked up an assist in the opening game at Davidson to claim the top spot for career assists. Johnson is now the most prolific passer in Tech history with 23 career assists. She is also the only Hokie to ever record three assists in a single game on two separate occasions.
- After scoring 10 goals this season, junior **Emily Jukich** has jumped into the records for career goals. She is now tied with Ashley Stinson (2004-2005) and Victoria Sarfo-Kantanka for the 3rd spot with 20 career goals. Her two scores against NC State also propelled the Tech forward into sole possession of seventh place for career points with 42. Jukich is also just the third Hokie to ever reach the double-digit goal mark in a single season.

IN THE ACC

- The Hokies were picked to finish eighth in the ACC by the league's 11 head coaches in the preseason poll.
- Currently, Tech is in sixth place with four conference matches remaining.
- All but one of Virginia Tech's remaining ACC matches will be held at home. Tech travels to Boston College on Sunday, Oct. 26, but hosts Maryland, Wake Forest and Duke to wrap up the conference slate.

RECEIVING VOTES

- Although not ranked, Virginia Tech received nine votes in the latest NSCAA/adidas poll, marking the second time this season the Hokies have received votes for the top 25.
- Tech last received votes after the Charlotte match the week of Sept 15.

UP NEXT

- Tech returns to ACC action on Sunday, Oct. 19 against the Maryland Terrapins at Thompson Field. Kickoff is scheduled for 5 p.m.

SCOUTING REPORT: LONGWOOD



- The Lancers travel to Blacksburg with a 6-4-2 overall record and a 1-0-1 mark in the United Soccer Conference.
- Longwood has recorded victories over Howard, St. Francis (Pa.), George Mason, Appalachian State, VMI and Liberty this season, while dropping contests to Charleston Southern, Radford, UNC-Wilmington and Richmond.
- In their last match, Longwood settled for a 0-0 tie against conference rival NJIT. The Lancers outshot the Highlanders 22-12, but neither team could net the game-winner in 110 minutes of play.
- For the season, Longwood has scored 15 goals in 12 games while allowing their opponents 11 scores.
- Kayla Huggins and Kacie Oliver lead the Lancer offense. Huggins has notched four goals and Oliver has tallied three scores in 2008.
- Marcia Biddle has started every contest in net for the Lancers and played all but 23 minutes of the season. She has made 67 saves and allowed 11 goals for a .88 goals-against average.
- Floyd E. Kellam High School will be well represented in Wednesday's match, as three players on the field graduated from the school in Virginia Beach, Va. Hokie freshman **Brittany Michels**, Lancer sophomore Laura Miller and senior Cassie Lynn all attended Kellam.

VIRGINIA TECH-LONGWOOD SERIES

- The Hokies are 2-0-0 all-time against Longwood.
- The two teams first met in 2004. The Hokies won that match 2-0.
- Last season, Tech traveled to Farmville, Va., for its second meeting with the Lancers. The Hokies won 4-0.
- Both **Jennifer Harvey** and **Jessica Varela** recorded their first career goals against Longwood in 2007.
- Junior **Emily Jukich** netted two goals in last year's match as well.
- Junior **Robin Chidester**, typically a forward/midfielder, took over the starting goalkeeper duties for an injured **Ashley Owens**. She recorded two saves while picking up her first career shutout.
- Tech has not allowed a goal in either meeting against the Lancers.

KELLY CAGLE
6th Season - Duke, 1996



Kelly Cagle is in her sixth season as the head coach of the Virginia Tech women's soccer program. Under Cagle's direction, the Hokies have continued their development into a

force in women's soccer within both the region and the nation. After five seasons at Tech, Cagle's teams amassed a 32-36-7 mark while competing in the Atlantic Coast Conference, arguably the toughest conference in the country, since 2004.

During her tenure, the program advanced to its first-ever NCAA Tournament in 2004 and defeated a nationally-ranked opponent for the first time. The team has re-written the record book, garnering 10 new team records and setting 10 individual records. Cagle has also coached the program's first All-American and ACC Freshman of the Year.

A 1996 graduate of Duke University, Cagle is quite familiar with the ACC after her playing days with the Blue Devils and a coaching stint at Wake Forest. She was a three-time all-America and all-ACC selection in 1993, 1994 and 1995. As team captain in 1995, she was named the ACC Player of the Year. Cagle was selected to the ACC 50th Anniversary Soccer Team and was named to the list of Top 10 athletes at Duke for the decade.

Cagle spent two seasons with the Atlanta Beat of the Women's United Soccer Association prior to taking the reins in Blacksburg. Before being selected in the 10th round of the WUSA draft, Cagle served as an assistant coach at Wake Forest, where she was also the recruiting coordinator. During her time at Wake Forest, the Demon Deacons were ACC finalist in 1999, made four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and were a Top 20 program from 1997-2000. Prior to her time at Wake Forest, Cagle was an assistant coach at the University of Texas during the 1996 season.

Kelly Cagle (formerly Walbert) is married to Dan Cagle. The couple has two daughters: Maggie and Nancy.
